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

NUTS AND BOLTS

On October 4th our first session of the "Saturday Morning Get Together" group got under way beneath a cloudy sky, that had followed the first real rain of the season. Our host. Doug Durein, had moved his cars outside where we did the usual tire kicking while enjoying fresh coffee and doughnuts. A little after 9:00 am, most of the participants had arrived and so we moved indoors for our tech session. In attendance were Doug Durein, Bill Cassiday, Charles Ebers, Bill Brommer, Joe Sernach, Walter Sowell, Johnny Crowell, Johnny's guest Mike Reilly, Ed Archer, and Frank Swanson.

One Club member brought his Schebler carburetor and asked for help in removing the float. This led to a discussion on the pros and cons of the use of ethanol in antique cars. We also discussed wind diverters for tow vehicles and their effectiveness. From personal experience I found there was an increase of as much as 4 miles per gallon to be achieved - very impressive in these days of high gas prices. Other subjects we touched on were: how to pressurize a Model T Ford gas tank, Dyna Beads for balancing antique tires, speedometers and gear ratios. We even learned a new use for condoms - but, you will have to ask Doug about that one!

For an update on a service many of us use - Monson Plating in Berkely is no longer doing any plating work. You will need to go to Johnson Plating in Oakland to have it done. And speaking of services - Walter Sowell said he was not happy with having his wheels redone for his 1911 Cadillac by an Amish wheelwright in Pennsylvania. He had rebuilt the wheels incorrectly and when Walter sent them back for correction, the man wanted additional money and held the wheels hostage until Walter sent another payment. He finally received his wheels, but definitely was not a happy camper. Joe Sernach has a good suggestion for being prepared for a flat tire fix while touring. Carry a 3 to 4 foot piece of pipe to extend the leverage on your lug wrench. This helps loosen those "too" tight lug nuts that may have been tightened with an impact wrench.

We all enjoyed Doug's sharing of his eclectic collection of automobilia and early household items - thanks Doug - the morning really did fly by quickly !

And so - finding this a great way to get together at least once a month in an informal setting - we have planned that next month's meeting will be at Bill Brommer's house on Saturday, November 8 th, 9am to noon. One of the subjects we will include is how to properly set up a Model T Ford coil. So please plan to join us, bring your projects and your questions - and I can guarantee we will have at least something to say about it.

STURGEON'S MILL TOUR October 19, 2008

It was an overcast and foggy day, not the type that you would ordinarily want to drive an "open car" around in contrasting to the weather the previous day which was hot, but you can't always pick the weather. At least it wasn't raining.

their EMF, Don and Joyce Azevedo drove their Buick, Doug King (minus Marylou who was in Israel touring) had his 1914 Ford speedster, Johnny and Christine Crowell were in the 1915 Locomobile (first time we had seen this on a tour – big six cylinder, nice nice car), Fred and Nancy Byl in their 1914 Model T (which Fred started with a single crank, attaboy Fred) (Nancy was out getting a latte with the girls while Fred was getting his Flivver running), and in their modern cars, JW and Barbara Silveira, Eric and Muriel Lundquist, Don and Pam Johnson. And touring sans car was David Pava and his dad. Great to see David's dad again. Nice group.

After donuts and orange juice, we left Petaluma and headed on Old Redwood Highway up toward Sebastapol and Graton, about 30 miles Northwest. Graton was an interesting town, looked like you could really enjoy yourself there, some small shops, restaurants, and yet only about eight miles from Santa Rosa. From Graton, we ventured down a small lane, then arriving at Sturgeons Mill, a working steam powered saw mill,







operated by a "not for profit" group, at the same site where the saw mill operated starting in the 1920's.

Our vintage cars were parked in a clearing with several vehicles from the Santa Rosa Horseless Carriage Club who we met at the Santa Rosa Golf and Country Club.

The SRHCC group didn't stay for lunch with us, but we had a good visit anyway.

Sturgeons Mill is in operation on the weekends during the summer, and saws redwood logs into 4x4fence posts, and rough redwood lumber. The mill is powered by a steam engine from the old US Mint in San Francisco, which feeds power to the mill through

various leather belts.

While there we saw several logs being cut into strips, and those strips then recut by a four saw cutter into boards.



The boards were stacked, and the offered for sale. Christine, our daughter, and her husband Luke, said the prices were very reasonable, especially for this nice redwood.

Lunch was served "chuckwagon" style, consisting of tri-tips, rack of ribs, hot dogs, etc., followed by a walking tour through the mill with very good docents. About 2:30 everyone headed back to Petaluma and then home. We will be visiting Sturgeon's mill again next year with the National Tour, and look forward to do this again.
