Other clubs and organizations to which I belong include the AACA, the NRA and the Pacific Locomotive Association, operators of the Niles Canyon Railway.


My professional career has revolved around real estate in the form of development, construction and management. Recently I have reduced that to property management only, to allow more time for hobbies!



Nothing else to report, sooo , HAVE A WONDERFUL NEW YEAR!




Old Sacramento Train Trip Saturday, January 15, 2011

Silver State Tour 2010

Sunday, Sept. 19th-Thursday, Sept. 23rd

We arrived in Truckee on a windy Sunday September 19th with 43 other vintage cars all 1916 or older from various places in California, Nevada, Oregon, Washington, Colorado and one from Utah.

Sunday afternoon, our first day, we went on a short tour around Donner Lake to Rainbow bridge learning about the history of the Donner party and their travel to California over the treacherous Sierras in the 1800's. The wind subsided and that evening we were greeted back at the hotel by a black bear in the meadow beyond the parking lot and a BBQ hosted by the Nevada Horseless Carriage Club.

The weather got warmer and better each day with day temperatures in the seventies. The hills were quite a test or challenge on our antique cars since there were several grades to climb and descend. Some elevations reached 9,000 feet. On Monday we went to Reno to Harrah's National Automobile Museum and had a great lunch and viewed all the cars in the collection. To get there, we were escorted down Highway 80 by the highway patrol a short distance and then we were able to get on some roads that were not as busy. On the travel coming back we went thru Carson City on highway 395 and then on the upgrade on Highway 50 thru Lake Tahoe and back to Truckee. We traveled 116 miles that day!

On Tuesday we traveled to the historic mining town of Virginia City. This route took us on the Mt Rose Highway 431 crossing Highway 395 and on to the upgrade of 341 to Virginia City. As we traveled slowly up the grade we had great views of the Carson Valley below which made the climb more enjoyable. Some of us dressed in our fashionable time period rags but all enjoyed the nostalgia of the old mining town. Some toured the town on the old trolley and some enjoyed the old train ride. We shopped down the streets and visited all the historic sites. On this day we traveled 118 miles - how many miles an hour? Not many miles an hour.....but a beautiful ride.

On Wednesday, we traveled to Lake Tahoe driving our enduring antiques around the beautiful scenery of North Shore Lake Tahoe up and down the grades to Zephyr Cove. In 1997 the Wall Street Journal described Lake Shore drive as the road where the Billionaires were chasing out the Millionaires. The trouble truck got a flat tire but made the ride in time to board the M. S. Dixie. All in a row we parked our hearty old cars and the tourist came in awe and took pictures while we took a ride on the M.S. Dixie paddle boat on Lake Tahoe to Emerald Bay. We were guests to a very tasty lunch and then the beautiful scenery of the Lake and its surroundings. It was a beautiful day with blue blue skies and warm weather for the first day of Autumn! Traveling back to Truckee to our hotel that afternoon was 92.5 miles.

Thursday, we toured the area north to Graeagle via Sierraville highways 89/49. Lots of country and wildlife sites and we did find a bit of flat land among the up and down grades and curvy hills. Some shopped and to their surprise, found some items they have been looking for many years. We had a delightful lunch at the Graeagle Fire Department Hall. After lunch we were back on the road enjoying the ride and the beauty crossing our fingers our cars would make the trip back to the hotel! We traveled 87 miles round trip. In the evening the Nevada Horseless Carriage Group hosted our dinner and the Awards presentation. Evening entertainment arrived in a roaring model T and delivered Mark Twain. We really enjoyed a fine tour and appreciate all the efforts of the Nevada Horseless Carriage Club! A few of us even won some money at the casinos which was a bonus! Wayne Edward Stanfield

September 9th 1921-November 20th 2010

Wayne was born in Highmore, South Dakota. Being an adventurer by nature during WWII he landed in the San Francisco Bay Area as a civilian employee road testing Army Jeeps manufactured at what was formerly the Durant car assembly plant on E. 14th St. in Oakland, CA. Wayne also worked at Alameda Naval Air Station and Camp Roberts Army Base in the lower Salinas Valley during the war.

By the end of the war Wayne had met and married Dorothy, the love of his life, a union that would last 44 years until Dorothy's passing in 1989. After stops in Paso Robles and Oakland, they settled into a modest home with a small detached garage in San Leandro, CA. Daughter Marcia joined the family in 1956. It was in that garage that Wayne worked his "metal-magic" on many pre-1916 car bodies that came in looking like the proverbial "sack-of-rocks" and rolled out eligible for participating in the legendary Reno Tours sponsored by the late Bill Harrah.

After the war Wayne picked up automotive metal finishing, AKA body and fender straightening, a skill that would make him a living until his retirement in 1979. When he retired he was a body-and-fender journeyman at Good Chevrolet in Alameda, CA. After he and Dorothy retired to the tiny Central Coast beach town of Cayucos in 1979, Wayne became an Auto Body Instructor at the local community college, Cuesta.

During the late 1950's or early 1960's Wayne was introduced to the Antique Car hobby and joined the Bay Area Horseless Carriage Club, joining forces with early BAHCC stalwarts such as "Bud" Lundell, Lawd William Cross, Bill Norton, and Jordy Carlton.

The general membership of the BAHCC soon discovered Wayne's body-and-fender skills and he, along with Bob Williams, Herb Huber, and Will Faulstick were responsible for resurrecting several "fugitives-from-the-scrap heap" into very presentable pre-1916 tour cars.

In 1989, 10 years after moving Cayucos, Dorothy passed away, propelling Wayne into the next phase of his life, acting! Soon he was a fixture in the Drama Department, earning three AA degrees and appearing in many Cuesta productions. He was proud to have provided the Joad's jalopy in *The Grapes of Wrath*.

Wayne's love of old cars and automobilia stayed with him throughout his senior years, as evidenced by the parts and project cars he had acquired in his home garage.

Wayne was a long-time member of both the HCCA and BAHCC, serving as President of the BAHCC in 1962 and 1974. He also served numerous terms on the BAHCC Board of Directors, working on many events and tours.

Wayne is survived by his daughter Marcia Benjamin (David) and his 14-year old granddaughter Miriam, the "light-of-his-life."

Hi Muriel,

Thanks for sharing this. I appreciate it.

My vision - which I hope to gain board support for this year - is that we do not email the Gazette - but rater we post a PDF to our website when it is published and email notification to our membership when we have done so. I do believe we need to continue to provide a hard copy to those members who want or need one - and that we establish a two tier dues structure to accommodate the cost of this, with the cost of Gazette postage and production added to the base lower cost dues for an "electronic communication" membership.

In similar fashion, I envision the master roster being maintained on the website - editable and maintained by our Membership Director - on an ongoing basis.

I am also interested in more formalized coordination between the board, and you - as our much appreciated Gazetted Editor - and our Webmaster - with the goal of improved communication to our membership. My vision is that the formal communication - and coordination of communication from the board this should be the responsibility of our VP (a role that today has virtually no specific responsibility).

The first piece of this process is now in place with the password protected roster on the website and the ability for board members (and others we designate) to communicate with all members, selected members and each other via email launched from BAHCC.org.

I welcome your participation and input to this process and the anticipated dialog. Likewise, I hope Erika and all interested members to share their thoughts.

My long-term vision is improved - more timely - BAHCC wide communication at a lower cost.
