





CONE CLUTCH IN EARLY HORSELESS CARRIAGES

Early horseless carriages used a simple "cone" clutch whereby the transmission side of the heavy engine flywheel was machined usually at a slight angle, 12.5 degree angle to accommodate a "cone" clutch fitted with leather materials and a spring. See diagram. When engaged, the "cone" mated with the flywheel providing power to the transmission. Flywheel and clutch were generally unprotected from road dust and dirt.

"Cone" clutches could be "grabby", hard to engage, hard to disengage, were prone to dirt and dust, plus they often slipped. As engine torques and horsepower increased, the "Cone" clutches were replaced by the modern "disc" clutch and enclosed flywheel housing. Volvo and many British manufacturers used a Laycock de Normanville "cone clutch" overdrive unit as late as the 1980's.

Our 1916 Overland Model 83 (built 1915) had a "jumpy" clutch when purchased. The former owner acknowledged this problem, and suggested oiling the leather with neats foot oil. The jumpy clutch caused driver stress, passenger stress and occasional whiplash. The car couldn't be driven in parades due to unpredictable starts. Once on the road it was fun.


BAHCC members recommended "check the leather", "make sure it is properly oiled", "adjust the linkage", etc., but none of this "fixes" worked including softening the leather with "Neats Foot Oil".

The Overland clutch came out in less than 15 minutes. Its leather was virtually "new" so why wouldn't it work. Our BAHCC Overland expert, Ken Ryan in Orangevale suggested we call a cone clutch re-leathering expert - Mr. Bob Knaak, 610 E Washington Ave., Orange CA 92866-2036 Tel 714-633-9736 bobknaak@gmail.com.

Bob asked whether we were aware that the Overland clutch had six "clutch spring plungers" between the cone face and the leather. If they were out of adjustment, the clutch would "grab". These "spring plungers" were <u>not</u> visible on the 1915 Overland cone clutch so this wasn't something that anyone would immediately recognize as being "the problem". And for 1915, they weren't adjustable.

The "spring plungers" (see photo) caused the leather to dimple, the dimple provided an easier "first bite" for the clutch, thus eliminating "jumping". Bob Knaak modified our clutch with "adjustable" springs as shown in the photo. Overland did the same beginning 1916. This was considered a maintenance item, that during "periodic maintenance", the mechanic would "loosen" the nut on the "spring plunger", tighten the screw, then reset the nut. This moved the plunger so that it would once again dimple as the clutch leather wore down. Bob Knaak re-leathered the clutch, retrofitted it with the "spring plungers" in less than two weeks at a cost of \$249.00 including freight. Our passengers now get a "good, non-jerky" ride in the Overland. Bob's "Service Bulletin" accompanied the re-leathered clutch. See photo.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR INSTALLING AND CARING FOR YOUR NEW LEATHER CONE CLUTCH LINING

I have already applied 100% pure "neatsfoot" oil to your new leather lining. This is the only oil I recommend you use and only if the clutch becomes grabby. Excessive application will cause the clutch to slip.

Thoroughly clean your flywheel area of all grease before installing the new cone.


Try to keep all motor oil and grease off your new leather lining. If you cone does get oily, I suggest you wipe clean with kerosene on a rag before it gets on the leather lining. If you leather lining does get oily, and the clutch slips, use "brake cleaner".

It may take a few miles with many shifts to break in your new lining.

Once lining is broken in, adjustment of your new "spring plungers" may be necessary. First check your clutch pedal linkage adjustment to make sure it is free to engage fully into flywheel. Next and this is very important, make sure there is 0.030" between the cone casting and the adjustment nuts on the "spring plungers". Less than 0.030" and your clutch will engage harshly. More than 0.030" and your clutch may drag causing the cone to continue spinning and difficulty in shifting into first gear. Uneven adjustment on the adjustment nuts will cause your clutch to pulsate when engaging. Use a screwdriver to stop the spring plunger from turning while turning the adjustment nut.
