All the other Board members wish you a Happy Thanksgiving and Holiday season and thank you for your support of the BAHCC activities this year.







- Capital Fund Investments Since the HCCA is now classified as a 501-C7 non-profit organization and does not have a tax status issue, the Board of Directors is looking to move some capital investments to longer risk safe higher rate investments. During period that the tax status was in question, investments were kept liquid pending the resolution of any tax liability. With the issue behind us, steps are being taken to improve the management of investments. A new finance committee was formed in June to look in to the options to get a better return while minimizing the risk.

A Tour summary page must be completed outlining the tour day information and the tour day directions scanned into a public domain format (PDF). When the function is added to Tour Library web site a notice will be sent out to all Regions and Registries.

HALLOWEEN TOUR OCTOBER 24, 2015

For a day that started out overcast and chilly, Saturday, October 24, 2015 turned into a very nice, comfortable day. Members and friends of the BAHCC gathered at the Bollinger Canyon Park and Ride in San Ramon at 8:00 a.m. One member, Paul Chabot left his home in Alameda at first light and drove to San Ramon in time for hot coffee and yummy donuts. His 1915 Saxon made the trip without a hitch.

From the Park & Ride lot, we traveled 14.7 miles through mostly residential, four-lane streets until we reached our destination, G & M Farms on East Airway Blvd. in Livermore. With the exception of a ¼ mile stretch of Saturday Road Work, the tour was uneventful.

We arrived at G & M just as they were opening. There we shopped for pumpkins and gourds and enjoyed the petting zoo, the pumpkin patch and the ever-popular corn pit which is a sensory experience for young and old alike. The pit is filled with feed corn about a foot deep and playing in it resembles the relaxing sensation of running your fingers through the sand at the beach. (Just like sand, the feed corn will be with you the rest of the day in the most inconspicuous places). G & M provides a fleet of Radio Flyer wagons for the little tykes to pull out to the pumpkin patch to retrieve their choice of pumpkins. There is also a tractor-pulled train for the little ones to ride. In addition to the antiques, we had participants in modern cars (Lundquists) whose family member, Carolyn and her children, from Hamilton, New Zealand had arrived just the night before the tour. Those younger family members made good use of all the attractions at G & M Farms.

Upon leaving the farm, we traveled back to San Ramon Valley Blvd. to Forest Home Farms. There, one can step back in time at this 16-acre park which was donated to the city of San Ramon by Ruth Quayle Boone, in honor of her late husband, Travis Boone, a direct descent of Daniel Boone. Mrs. Boone's vision was to preserve Forest Home Farms in perpetuity so the people in the area could enjoy the beauty of this bountiful land that had sustained families for generations. During its hay-day, the farm was a walnut-processing center from the early 1930s. The family had weathered the great depression with the sale of their crops and had employed many from the area. The property, now part of the National Register of Historic Places, as well as the California Register of Historical Resources, features two historic houses (the 22-room Dutch colonial Boone Home where the family had resided, and the Glass House). There is also







a Tractor Museum, many barns for horses, sheep and the all-important blacksmith. At this time there is an effort by the San Ramon Historic Foundation to restore an old, 1850's barn.

Our club displayed several Horseless Carriages, including a 1910 Buick, owned by Ed & Carolyn Harley, a 1913 Buick, owned by Jon & Amelia Alff, whose guest, niece Ijsaso was visiting from Spain. Charles Ebers drove his immaculate 1912 Ford mother-in-law Roadster and Ed & Karen Archer drove up from Hayward in Casey, their 1915 Ford Race Car. Don & Joyce Azevedo and guests Alex, Jessica and Santana participated in their 1914 Model T Touring car and Bill and Kaaren Brommer drove to San Ramon in their faithful 1926 Ford Coupe. Johnny & Christine Crowell rolled up in a beautiful 1936 Packard, V-12 Phaeton. Many members of a local Packard Club were there with their beautiful cars as well. We picnicked in the barn and took some tours of buildings and houses before departing the farm that day. We also had opportunity to visit with Mark and Veronica Cerruti and their children, George and Samantha who had ioined us there.

Stuffed Pumpkin

No one seems to think of having pumpkin except in a pie. Try this recipe and be surprised-it is as good as the best squash and the presentation is beautiful.

1 small whole pumpkin about five pounds Boiling salted water

2 tablespoons salad oil

2 pounds ground beef

1 large onion, finely chopped

1 medium green pepper, finely chopped

2 teaspoons salt

2 teaspoon oregano

l teaspoon vinegar

Freshly ground pepper to

2 cloves garlic, mashed

3/4 cup seedless raisins

1/3 cup sliced pimiento-stuffed green olives

2 teaspoons capers

1 8-ounce can tomato sauce

1/2 cup red wine

3 eggs, beaten

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. With a sharp knife, cut a circular top about 5 inches in diameter out of the pumpkin. Save the top to use as a lid. Scoop out pumpkin seeds and scrape inside of pumpkin clean. Place it in a large kettle and over with boiling salted water, cover kettle. Bring water to a boil, lower heat, and simmer for about 30 minutes until pumpkin meat is almost tender. The pumpkin should still be firm enough to hold its shape well. Carefully remove from water and drain well. Dry the outside and sprinkle a little salt on the inside. Set aside. In a heavy skillet with a cover heat salad oil. Add ground beef, onion, and green pepper, cook over medium high heat until beef is browned and crumbly. Remove from heat and add salt, oregano, vinegar, pepper, and garlic. Stir in raisins, olives, and capers, then gradually add tomato sauce and red wine. Cover skillet, return to heat, and simmer for about 15 minutes, stirring occasionally. Cool slightly and add beaten eggs, mixing thoroughly. Fill cooked pumpkin with meat stuffing, pressing to pack firmly. Cover loosely with pumpkin lid and place in a greased shallow baking pan. Bake for 1 hour. Allow to cool for 10 to 15 minutes before serving. To serve, carefully lift stuffed pumpkin onto a serving plate. Slice from top to bottom in flat wedges, spooning more meat filling onto each slice. Serves four to six.

The BAHCC Board met at Fred Byl's home on September 16, 2015. The meeting was called to order by President Eric Lundquist at 7:45 P.M. with all Board members present except Gerry Robinson and Bill Schrambling.

<u>Minutes:</u> The minutes to the June Board meeting were read by Secretary Don Azevedo. The minutes were approved as read.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: We have had no recent banking activity. We project with the planned expenses that our treasury at year's end will be ahead of last year's amount in the bank.

After discussion Eric moved to give a \$200 honorarium to the one-room school house in San Ramon that the club visited during the Blackhawk Cars and Coffee event lead by Ed Harley. Jon seconded the motion which passed.

Ed proposed the Club help financially on the construction of the teeter-totter ramp that will be used at Casey's Birthday Party. Web Site:

Jon Alff discussed the current situation with the web site. The upgrading is looking great; however, there are some glitches with certain web site pages or communication with some computers.
