- HCCA Tour Library New Tour Entry—During the Board meeting at Hershey, a decision was made to simplify and adjust the Tour Library program to reduce tour input costs. Procedures were created and standards were set to make sure new tours are easy to submit. Each tour submitted will generally not be older than 10 years when submitted. A Tour summary page must be completed outlining the tour day information. If the tour day directions are scanned into a public domain format (PDF) file then there will be no cost to enter a new tour. When the new entry function is added to the HCCA web site, a notice will be sent out to all Regions and Registries.
- HCCA (Office Documents Project) All of the HCCA office and organization documents have been converted to digital files. Because some of the documents offer services and help to members that is part of their membership, the access to those documents will be limited to members while documents with general information will not have restricted access. As we move in to the next year, we plan to create the area that will be divided in to sections for the document storage. Members will to be able to find any information they want about the HCCA club Policies, Procedures, Applications, Instructions and Information.
- HCCA Friend This is an initiative at the local level to find neighboring people willing to volunteer helping a HCCA member that needs help getting communication and or attending events. There are situations where members are

unable to connect to the internet and or need help attending tours and other events. A HCCA friend is a person willing to help a member in need ... a resource of friends ... If you know of any members that are acting as Friends, please let me know so their efforts can be recognized.

• 2016 HCCA FL National Convention ... Mark your calendar – From CA to AZ to TX, the HCCA National Annual Convention and Tours next year will be April 3 – 8, 2016 at the Hampton Inn in Brooksville, FL. More details will be provided as we get closer ... "Swarm to BEE Warm". Tours, Events, Seminars and Presentations will attempt to meet the goal of Sharing, Education and Pass it on. Though the event allows us to conduct club business face to face it reunites old hobby friends and allows us to expose the public to the Horseless Carriage Club of America in another part of the country.


November Nuts and Bolts

The November Nuts and Bolts session was held at the Durein Garage on Saturday the 7th. We intended to learn about the lingo related to front ends, such as caster, camber, toe in, shimmy, loose bushings and bearings, tracking and tire wear. Before we could begin this discussion, Ed Archer and Bill Brommer drove in with Ed's Auburn followed by new-member Jim Lukash and his 1913 Model T Ford touring. Ed and Bill met Jim at the Dumbarton Bridge and led him to Alameda. Jim lives in Palo Alto and drove the 43 miles to the Nuts and Bolts! Well, the group began studying the new car in the club and decided it is a great addition to the club; however, a couple of the top bow sockets needed some attention. To Jim's initial dismay, members began dismantling his car, taking parts into the shop for correction. Soon surgery was over and the car was back together looking as good as new. Jim was relieved once he realized: one, professionals were attacking Lucy, his pride and joy, and two, he was not going to receive a bill for the work. The work on the car even included a driving lesson on how to shift the ruxtell. After the car was back together, we congregated in the garage and learned about caster and camber and all other front end alignment issues. A through discussion with personal examples kept everyone's attention. As the Nuts and Bolts session came to an end and Jim prepared for the trip home, Paul Chabot, being enamored with the 1913 Model T Ford and Jim's bravery, asked if he could ride with Jim to Palo Alto. Jim, of course, welcomed the company, but wondered how Paul would get back home in Alameda. That was the least of Paul's worries as he wanted a ride. This illustrates what the BAHCC and our Nuts and Bolts sessions are all about: comradery, helping out each other and learning something new or technical. The 15 members and guests in attendance agreed it was a great day!

Alignment

The main purpose of wheel alignment is to make the tires roll without Scuffing, slipping, or dragging under all operating conditions.

- Caster
- Camber
- Toe
- Steering axis inclination
- Toe-out on turns (turning radius)
- Tracking (thrust line)


