

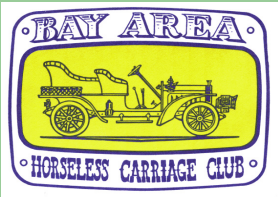

Let us know if you are planning to bring chili.

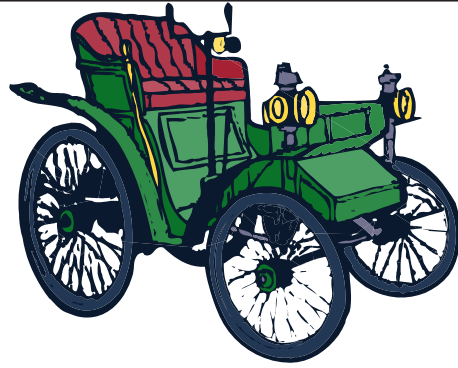

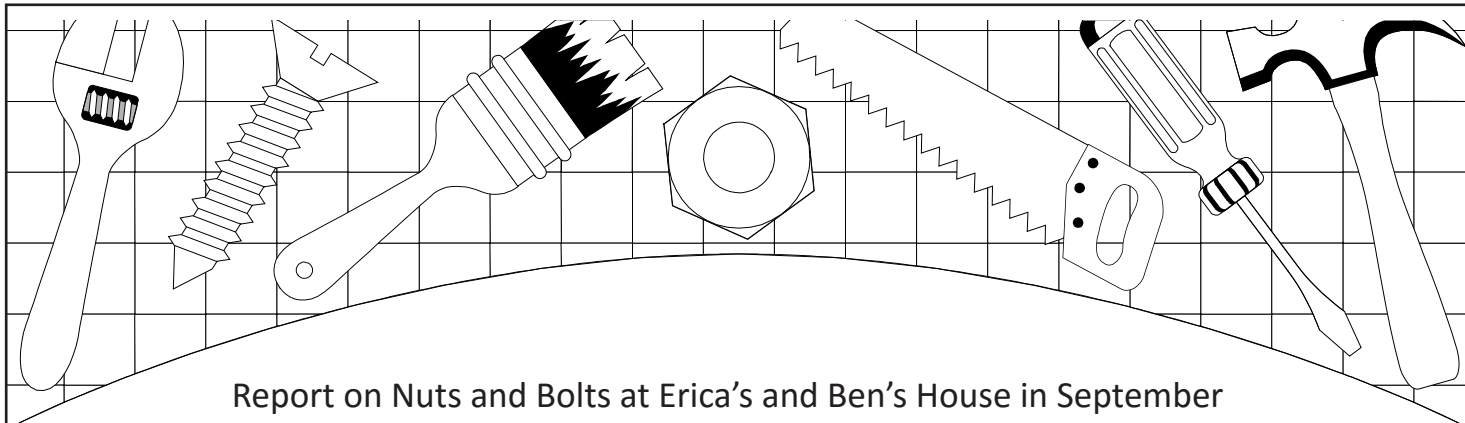

Event Report—BAHCC at the 16th annual Antique Autos at History Park

One of the very best annual events in California for antique car lovers is called Antique Autos in History Park, and this year's was the 16th annual (Sunday, September 11), and it was probably the best one ever! Cars in stock condition from 1900 – 1945 are invited each year, and this year there were over 125 present (no hot rods allowed). But would you believe that this year for the first time they did bend one of the rules, but not in the way you might imagine. They let in an 1899 Osen and Hunt automobile, and it was highly featured. What is so special about this Osen and Hunt is that it was actually built new in San Jose!

The Osen and Hunt Company built one or more of these little putt-putts in 1899 utilizing mostly bicycle parts (as did most extremely early automobile manufacturers), and this one was originally sold to a San Jose doctor who used it to drive to his house calls.

Recent research shows that the very same car was used by a California fellow much later in some horseless carriage activities of the 1960's, was eventually sold to another California horseless carriage guy who became inactive, and it was left in storage in that person's garage and became all but forgotten for another fifty-plus years until coming to light just recently.

Many of you know of fellow hobbyists Dan and Cindy Erceg of San Jose, guest participants occasionally at BAHCC events including short tours and Piedmont Fourth of July Parades. Dan found out about the existence and the potential availability of this vehicle through happenstance from one of our own longtime members, and Dan literally lost considerable sleep figuring out just how to accomplish its acquisition by the History San Jose Museum, which is indeed "where it belongs" and where it is now.

The full story is not being told in this article because we hope to invite Dan and Cindy to a BAHCC meeting early next year and ask them to share "the rest of the story" with us.

At the Antique Autos in History Park event, Dan gave just such a presentation to a very attentive and appreciative crowd, then started the car and gave short rides around the park to certain dignitaries, including an actual descendant of one of the two manufacturers. You will recognize the car photo by its extremely cute "parasol top". And during these rides, the second oldest auto present followed the Osen and Hunt around the park very efficiently and much

more quietly—the 1905 Studebaker electric owned and driven by Norman Schwartz. The whole thing was quite a site and was tremendously enjoyed by the crowd, which is why this year's event may have been the best of all of the Antique Autos in History Park in its 16-year history.

We were well represented by many— new member Taylor Andre (Gilroy, 1915 Saxon), Ed and Karen Archer, Bill Austen, Don and Joyce Azevedo, Bill and Kaaren Brommer, Bill Cassiday, Mark Cerruti, Anthony Dunlop, Charles Ebers, Ed Harley, Bill Hund and Mary Mendes, new member Jim Lukash (Palo Alto, 1913 Model T), Donna Jones, John Morrison, Norman Schwartz and Tony Wollesen, many of whom brought cars to display.

It was a beautiful day, and Don and Joyce Azevedo and John Morrison spent it providing passers-by with photo-ops in either of two antique cars as a fund raiser for HCEI, donations adding up to approximately \$229.

As more candy and treats are given out at their store.*

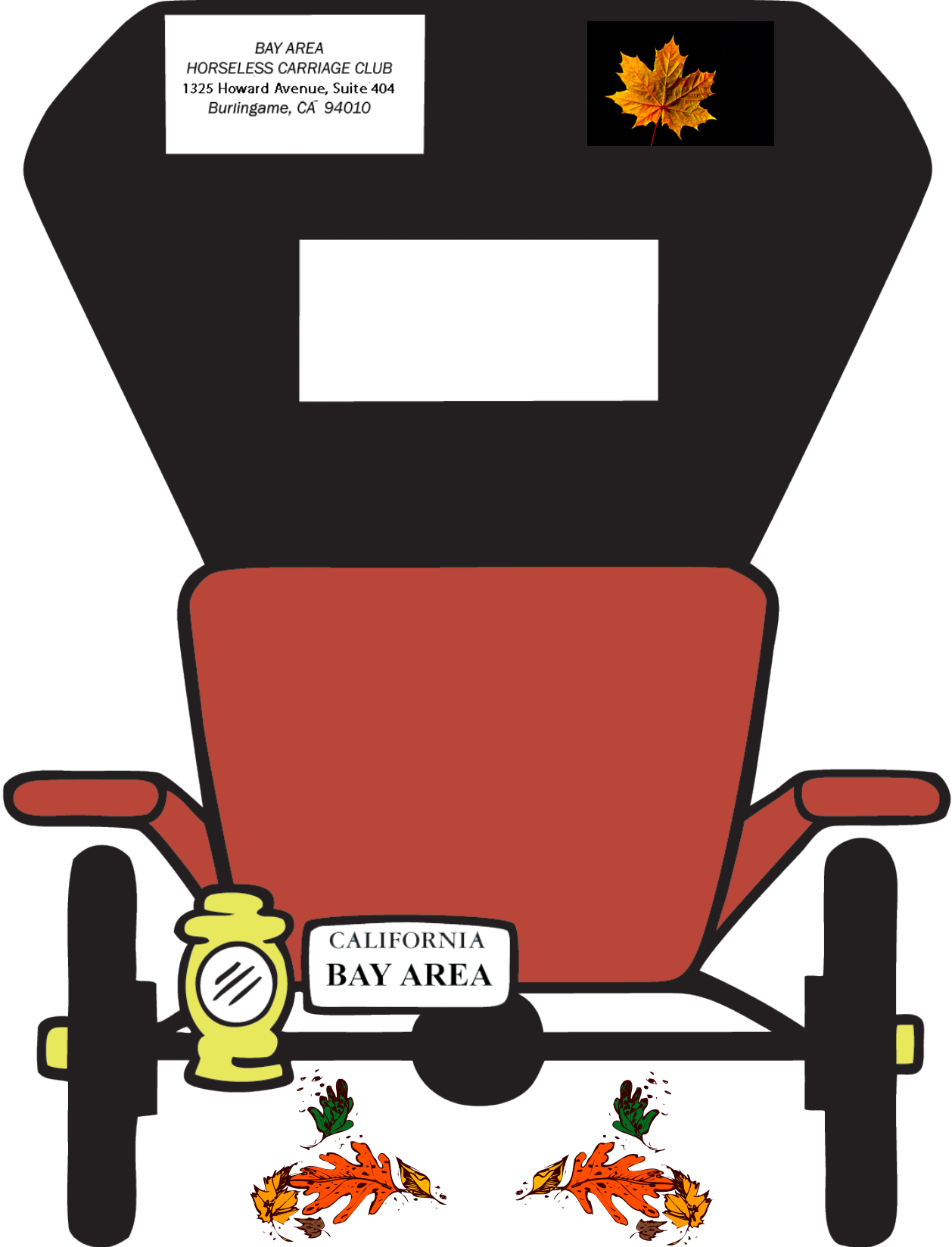
