


FEBRUARY NUTS AND BOLTS



Old Time Swanton CA Horseless Carriage Campout June 3-4th 2017



There are members of the Horseless Carriage Club who have cars and collect vintage camping equipment. This event is designed for them. Join us for something new: a BBQ and an old-time overnight campout in beautiful Swanton CA on the north Santa Cruz County seacoast. The campout is under trees along historic Big Creek at the location of the original hotel for commuters by stagecoach from Santa Cruz to San Francisco. Campers can join in for a campfire sing along with old time banjo and ukulele music

performed by HCCA members. There will also be an optional hike up the river to the beautiful waterfalls on the creek. The BBQ portion is open to all HCCA members with a Pre-WWII cars and the campout itself is for vintage campers only after 4pm.

Some Details and Requirements:

- Membership in the national HCCA is required for drivers no exceptions.
- Canvas tents up to the 1950s are required. No modern equipment, post 1942 camp trailers, no synthetic materials please. Cotton sleeping bags and wool blankets with sleeping cots are strongly preferred. The ground is ungraded, so the sleeping cots are for ones own benefit.
- Pre 1932 cars only for the campout.
- An attempt at wearing vintage clothing should be made by campers- IE: Overalls, wool pants
 with suspenders or breeches, boots, plaid shirts, skirts and cotton blouses, funny hats.
- The call to join the campout is being made early, so members can collect the necessary camping equipment over the next year.
- No radios or modern electronics please. Cell phones for emergencies only please. Note that reception is very poor to non-existent in any case.
- Bathroom facilities limited to porta-potties. Vintage Coleman lanterns and antique flashlights recommended for nighttime visits. It gets very dark in the canyon.
- No firearms or fireworks or hard drinking. No open fires except for a communal fire pit.
 Participants are expected to behave and to respect the private property, so that events like this can happen in the future at this site.
- No pets allowed in respect for livestock and the possibility of attracting wild animals.
- Space is limited. Registration is closed after May 1st 2017. \$25 deposit for the campout,
 \$15/person for the potluck.
- Low cost expected. Price less than \$75 per individual. Details to come. If there are excess funds, a refund will be made to participants.
- There is a short tour leaving Capitola at 10am. BBQ and potluck at noon.
- Breakfast served on location Sunday morning. Campers returning to Santa Cruz on their own.

BAHCC Minutes of General Meeting of January 4, 2017 (as yet unapproved)

1. President Don Azevedo called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. and asked if there were guests.
