
You may bring dessert to share, if you like.



"Lozier and the Picnic" from Horseless Carriage Gazette, January-February 1970



Ben Sharpsteen grew up during the early days of the automobile. Ben first visited his grandmother's farm in Calistoga in the summer of 1903. Ben would spend every succeeding summer there, up to and including 1915, when he was 20 years old. It was in Calistoga that Ben would develop his love for the country life, and the automobile. Ben would eventually find his way to the Disney Studios, where he would make movie history, only to eventually give it all up and return to his beloved Calistoga.






Ben's Artwork appeared on 19 front & back covers of the "Horseless Carriage Gazette" from 1964 to 1975




Ben spent 33 years with Disney Studios, from 1929 to 1962. Ben began his career with Disney as an animator, but went on to make many classic Disney films. The Disney films that listed him as either producer or director included: *Pinocchio, Dumbo, Fantasia, Snow White, Cinderella* and numerous nature films, including *Bear Country, The Living Desert, Beaver Valley* and others.





Horseless Carriage Cartoons From The Past

THE TICKMOBILE



In the year 1907, the steeple clock in the type of a giant wagon spring clock disappeared from the Santa Clara Village church and in a few months time, Messrs. Max Koby and Ed Anderson came upon the scene driving the Tickmobile. They vowed the pilferage of afore said clock was none of theirs, as the alter boy had recognized portions of the car as that of the steeple's clock.

Public pressure was applied to the two suspects and the clock was restored in 1912.

I recently told Mark Cerruti about some cartoons I still had copies of that were mostly done by the late Bud Lundell, long-time BAHCC member who brought our club lots of laughs because of his wit and uniqueness. Mark checked them out and decided he would like to re-run them over time for your enjoyment.

Each cartoon was designed to poke fun at one or more other members, achieved by Bud's "inventing" and drawing a car that these other members supposedly owned. The first cartoon in the series was called "The Tickmobile," which Bud alleged was a car built and owned by fellow horseless carriage hobbyists Max Toby and Ed Andersen, who were at that time members of what was called the San Francisco Regional Group (a neighboring group that later was abandoned). The Tickmobile cartoon, printed above, was especially funny because the two of these guys were also known as antique clock collectors and restorers.





BAHCC General Meeting Minutes from October 3, 2018

Call to Order—President Ed Archer called the meeting to order at 7:37 p.m. There were no guests to introduce. Ed noted that again at this meeting there were numerous members without name badges, and he reminded that members need to please remember to wear them as a courtesy to new members and guests.

Approval of Minutes—Ed asked if there were any corrections or additions to the draft of the 9/5/18 minutes that were printed in the October issue of the Gaslight Gazette. Don Azevedo noted that the September meeting's treats had been provided by Chris Crowell, not by Joyce Azevedo, and then the minutes were approved with that correction made.

Health and Welfare—John Morrison reported that member George McCrumb was absent tonight because he had been accidentally hurt and was recovering in a rehab facility in San Leandro. Tony Wollesen added that Santa Clara Valley fellow car hobbyist Chet Zimmerman, whom many of us have known for many years, had passed away recently at age of approximately 97.

Treasurer's Report—Treasurer Whitney Haist said all accounts are balanced and in good order.

Tour Chair Report—Johnny Crowell asked for reports of progress that members could share regarding the upcoming Ben Sharpsteen Museum display our club is working on. Vince O'Brien shared ideas he has been thinking about for a tour or gathering to take place along with the opening of the display. Ideas were described and pros and cons or questions were added as food for thought. Don Johnson said maybe Doug Durein (not present tonight) and the late Doug King had chaired a tour in the Calistoga area in the past, and that Doug Durein might have some good ideas for Vince. Vince said he will poll interest and gather more information. Kaaren Brommer cautioned that she had tried to line up lodging in Calistoga for the grand opening event and had been repeatedly told there was nothing known to be available.

Johnny asked if someone could report on the recent Antique Cars in History Park event. Ed Archer and others made comments about the event this year. It was again a very good event with a great many stock pre-1946 cars, and was very entertaining and successful again. John Morrison had brought three large round tables along with chairs and umbrellas for BAHCC use, but there was only a small number of our members in attendance. He noted however that numerous members of other regional groups joined us and a good time was had by all. Ed Archer said that no rent is charged by the City of San Jose for the use of History Park for this huge annual event, and he added that he was aware that one or more other car clubs

had therefore made donations to the City of San Jose in appreciation of this event, possibly something we could consider doing in the future as well.

Johnny also reminded us that the Schwartz family is again planning to have a Pilgrims' Tour in or near Martinez, one where everyone brings their Thanksgiving leftovers the Saturday after Thanksgiving.

Website Report—Don Azevedo reported that all of the proposed website updating is now completed and incorporated.

Gaslight Gazette Report—Editor Mark Cerruti said he would appreciate receiving more information about the upcoming Ben Sharpsteen Museum's BAHCC Display that he can incorporate into the Gazette.

Karen Archer asked about Ironstone. It was then reported that the Haists won a first place award with their Stevens Duryea, and that this year's Ironstone event was as good as or even better than ever. Apparently there was more to see and do of interest, including a series of antique car races on a dirt and gravel oval track they had made. Our own Ed Archer and quite a few other race car drivers participated in it, and for a price, members of the audience could purchase a ride in the "mechanic's seat" of some of the race cars, too. The race track was wet down by a water truck, making the rides even more exciting. Karen Archer said the passengers who paid for the rides seemed quite happy to be muddy; it was as though the muddy clothes became a "badge of honor!"

Some members reported having been able to find lodging in Calistoga at this time and that they did successfully awhile back. It was also noted that Vince O'Brien is still looking at the possibility of holding some form of club activity to coincide with the opening of the exhibit.

Website Report—Don Azevedo said Mark Wheeler, our webmaster, has completed all the items that he was asked to do.

Newsletter Report—Editor Mark Cerruti shared that the Schwartzes had sent him a full page announcement on the upcoming Sharpsteen Museum display. Mark has also found various other interesting materials that he is looking forward to including in the next and future gazettes.

Unfinished Business—Ed Harley noted that the next Board Meeting will be held at the Brass Door Restaurant on November 14th. The meeting was moved up by one week because the third Wednesday of November was felt to be too close to Thanksgiving. Ed Harley will send out an invitation to everyone concerned that will also include information about the four menu item choices that will be available, and all those coming will be asked to inform Ed of their preferences so he can communicate that to the restaurant.

Appreciation Dinner/Certificates of Recognition—The Board discussed the idea of this topic, and the consensus is that this is a very good idea. Continued discussion will occur at subsequent board meetings.

Filling 2 unfilled Board Positions—Don Azevedo said he has talked to several folks to try to fill them for 2019 and has now been able to do so. (Vince O'Brien and Jon Eugenio will be filling those two positions.)

Club Jackets project—John Morrison has been in touch with HCCA National Director Keene Brewer, who is currently in charge of merchandising for the HCCA. They too are looking for a source for suitable jackets for national club use but have not settled on anything yet that they like. Chris and Johnny Crowell said that they may have a source, and it was suggested that John Morrison and Don Azevedo send them photos of ones from the past that they could show to their contact person for more ideas. John and Don agreed to send photos to Chris and Johnny.

BAHCC Holiday Party—It was asked what help might be needed by Carolee Morrison regarding the Christmas Party. Carolee was not present, but John said she always likes help with decorating tables. Don Azevedo volunteered that he and Joyce would decorate one, so did Ed Harley, and so did the Crowells. John said Carolee will check with other members that have typically decorated tables and/or taken care of the bar in the past.

New Business—Mark Cerruti passed out copies of forms he made that will be mailed to all members as a reminder that dues will soon be due for 2019 BAHCC membership. They looked excellent. Whitney Haist said he would prefer them to be timed so that they are received near the end of the year rather than sooner so that he won't get flooded with checks before December 1st.

Next Meeting—As previously mentioned, the next board meeting is November 14th at the Brass Door Restaurant. And subsequently, the first board meeting of 2019 will be January 16th at John and Carolee Morrison's house.
