





## **A London-Brighton Adventure**

Every adventure has a beginning and an end. This one starts with the tearing of a red flag and ends with a warm cup of chili and rice. In between is what I can only describe as adventure.

By tradition, the London-Brighton veteran car run begins with a ceremonial destruction of a red flag signifying the 1896 repeal of a red flag law which required that a motorized carriage be preceded by an escort carrying a flag to warn others of the impending arrival of one of these new age devices.




This is where the adventure begins for 450 like-minded old car enthusiasts who collect in Hyde Park the first Sunday of every November to celebrate the dawn of the automobile age and to see if they can coax their cars, all built before 1905, sixty long miles from London to Brighton Beach, on the South coast of England.



At the halfway point in Crawley (probably appropriately chosen to remind us of the speed of these vehicles in contrast to today's cars), I was approached by a film crew for an interview. The essence of their line of questioning was "why do you do this?" In my case, why do you ship an open 1-cylinder car all the way from California, to drive 60 miles in cold, and usually wet weather over challenging terrain, competing with modern cars and busses for the road.



For me, it is the challenge and the experience. The challenge of actually making it all the way to Brighton before the 4:30 cutoff ("punctual arrival"), knowing that about 20% of the field does not finish. Mostly, it is about the experience. Not only is it the longest running old car event in the world (this year was billed as the 122<sup>nd</sup> anniversary run), but where else can you partake in an event with so many other old car nuts.



This year was especially good.... no rain, no massive roadworks to slow your progress and the largest crowds of onlookers I have ever seen. Yes, I have done this run before. Somehow, I can't get enough and keep coming back. With less than 10 runs under my belt, I still feel like a newbie. I met an Englishman who has done it 59 times! As I said, the crowds of onlookers were especially plentiful this year, some camped out in lawn

chairs or viewing from the back of open SUVs along the way. When you get out into the countryside, groups of people cluster around roadside pubs to cheer you on and "modern" car clubs use this as an opportunity to bring out their old cars for display along the route. I am not sure who is the biggest spectator, us or them.




This is probably the best run I have done. The weather cooperated, traffic was manageable, lots of encouragement... all until about 8 miles from the finish. There was a loud

crashing noise from under the seat and the unmistakable tinkle of metal parts on the road. As it turned out, a counterbalance on the crankshaft had come loose and left a gaping hole in the top of the engine case. Undeterred, we gathered up all the parts, got the car started and coaxed it all the way to Brighton. The bowl of chili and finishers medal felt especially good this year. One thing about the old car hobby, you never run out of projects.
