# Four Days at Hershey, 2019

It's officially known as The Eastern Division AACA National Fall Meet and it takes place every October on the grounds and parking lots surrounding Hersheypark and The Giant Center in beautiful Hershey, PA. Since its inception in 1955, Hershey has grown to be one of the largest antique automobile shows and flea markets in the United States.

The fun starts on Wednesday and it's over on Saturday. There you will see a 1,000 car, Car Corral, and a 9,000 space Flea Market. They say that if you walk to see each space on the field, you will have walked 29.5 miles in the three and a half days it is open. On Saturday you will see a Car Show, featuring over 1,400 vintage vehicles. Also, there is a Ladies Luncheon, High Wheeler Contest, Race Car Condition Run, Judging School, AACA Juniors, Talent Show and Old Time Movie Night.



vehicle, as it was originally sold piece by piece, from a catalog published by the A.L.Dyke Auto Supply Co. of St. Louis. There are only three Dykes known to exist today. There, they met a gentleman who owns an extensive collection of Dyke literature and an original Dyke engine, but no Dyke Automobile. That man was in the audience of bidders at the RM Hershey auction. When the little red Dyke rolled up on the auction ramp, the bidding was fast and furious. The hammer fell in less than sixty seconds after bid opening. At that time, the gentleman from St. Louis became the proud new owner of the car he needed in his unique collection. He later told Doug, he was not going home without that car.

Attendance is projected at 200,000 people. The HCC national has a tent on the field which is a welcome spot to sit and rest and chat with other horseless carriage members. Other than the Dureins and the Haists, I did not see any other BAHCC members there. If I missed you in the crowd of 200,000, please let me know and I'll correct the report.

Each year, in conjunction with the meet, RM Sotheby conducts a two-day auto auction. This year, there were several large brass era collections offered for sale. This brought out lots of horseless carriage enthusiasts. Doug and Susan Durein saw this as great opportunity to offer their 1903 Dyke to the highest bidder. The Dyke, as you know, was a very unique



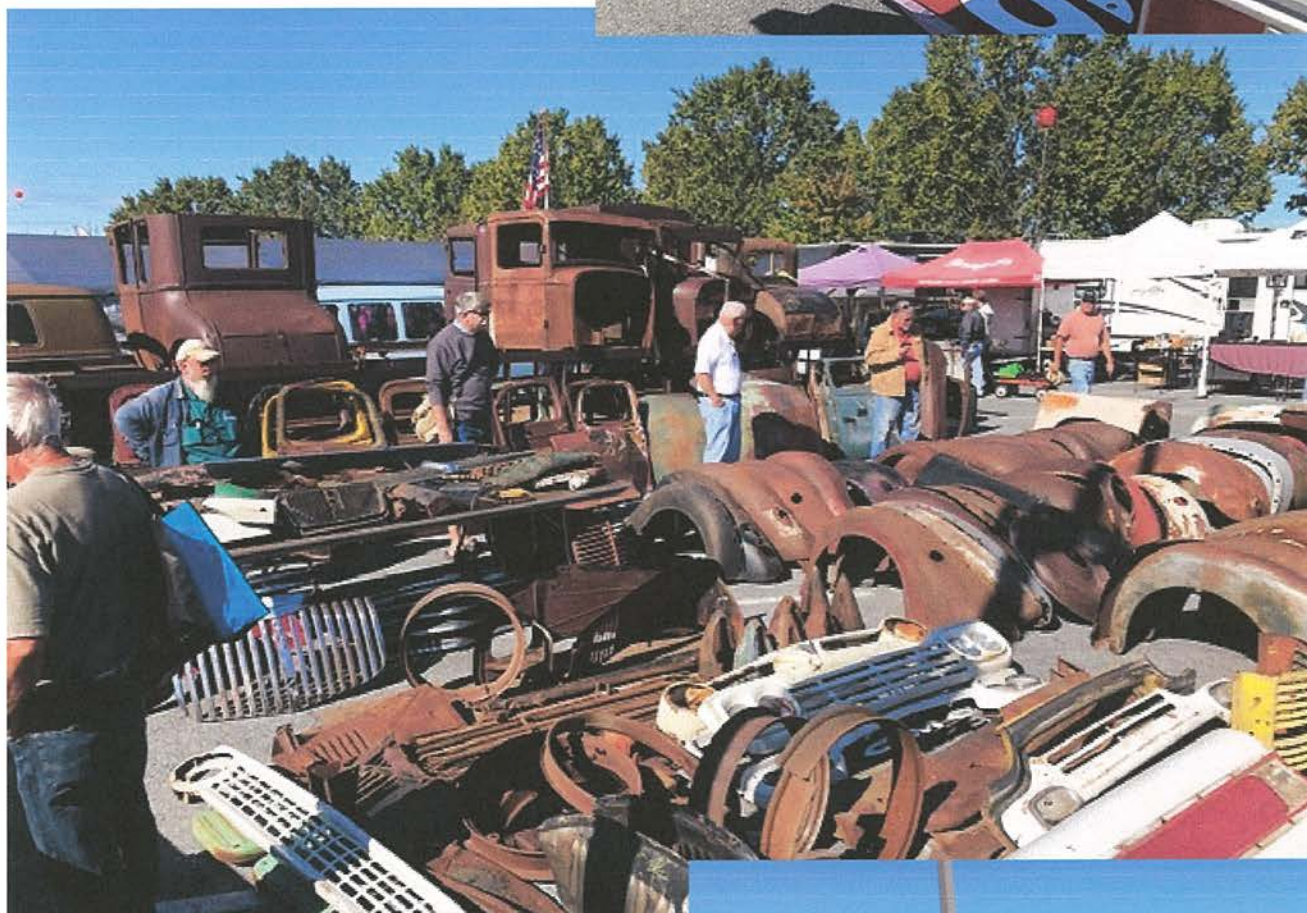

Just remember this: If you're lucky enough to be into old cars, you're lucky enough!

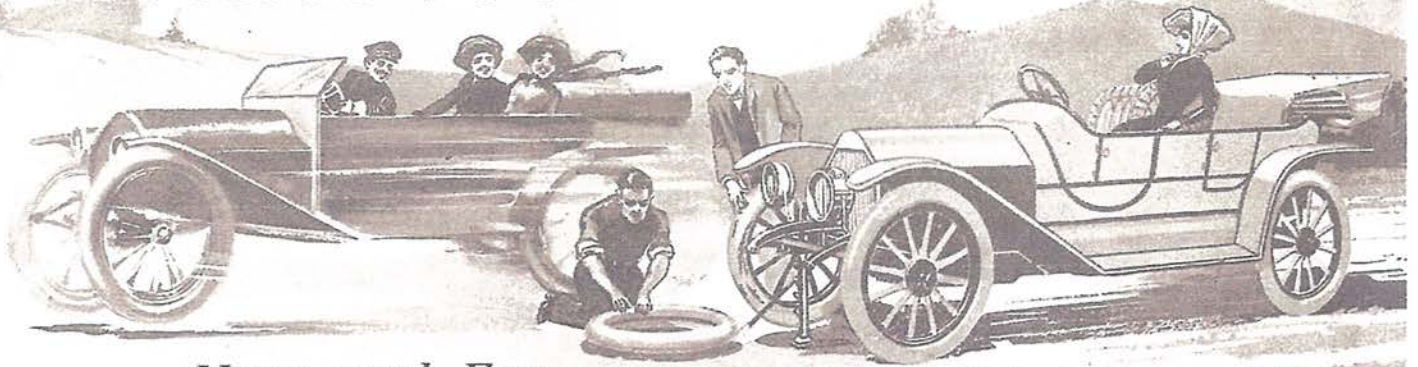

The event will include working on the front suspension and steering column of a 1929 La Salle and also the need to try to get a Model A Ford started, and he noted there would be his 1910 Kleiber truck and his 1907 Cadillac single cylinder tulip bodied roadster to see there as well.

Christine asked for a volunteer to talk about the recent Antique Cars at History Park event. Tony Wollesen reported that all the street parking available in the whole park was taken—that the event was absolutely full this year, and the weather was excellent, not as hot as last year. The meeting was adjourned at 8:11 p.m. to treats.

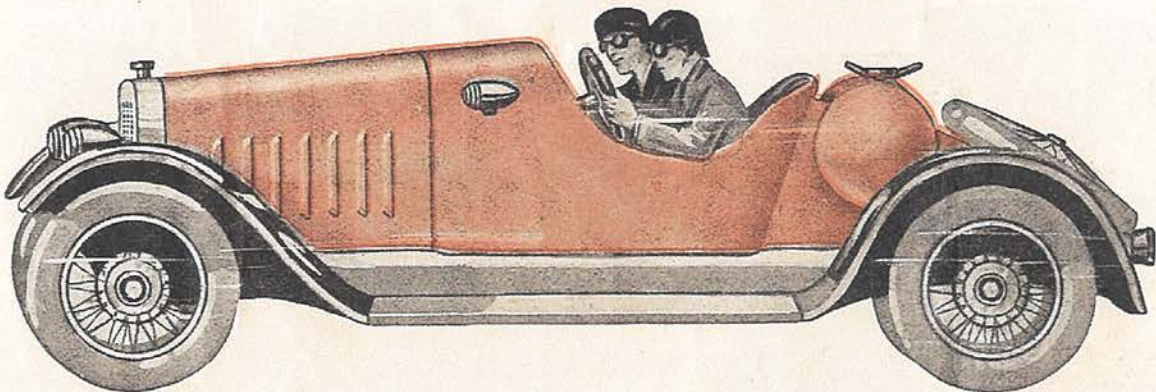
