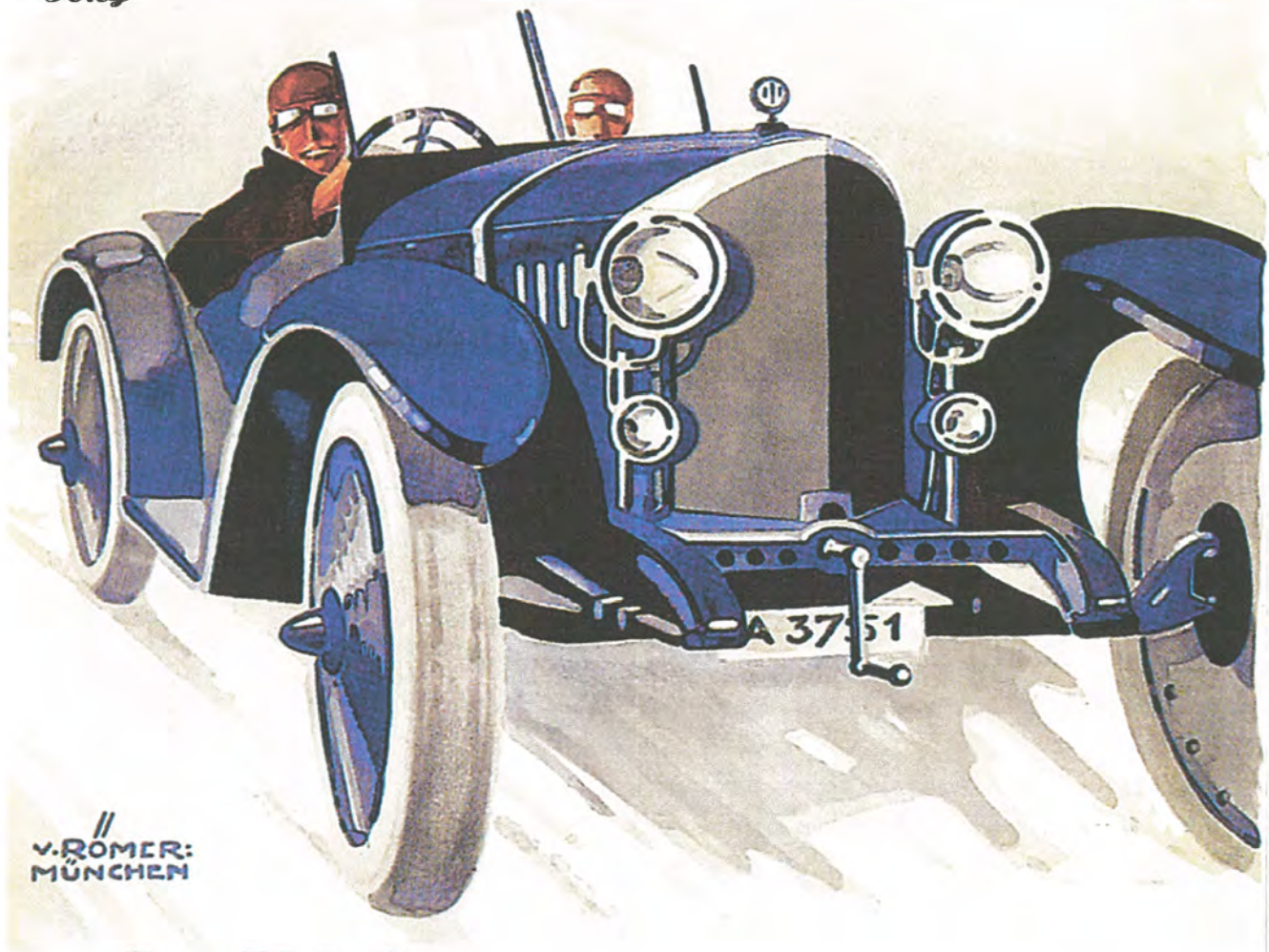

## Dateline:

# London – First Sunday in November

This is the time of year when 500 or more cars normally congregate before dawn in Hyde Park, London to brave the elements and coax their pre-1905 cars 60 miles to Brighton on the South Coast. It is the longest running old car event in the world, commemorating the emancipation of the automobile – the striking down of the red flag law which required a person to precede an automobile waving a red flag to warn those ahead of what was to come.

The event, officially known as the London-Brighton Veteran Car Run, was first staged in 1896 and had been held every year since 1927 except during World War II and now- what will surely be remembered as the COVID pandemic year.

In May or June, the organizers of the run had high hopes that the run would proceed this year on a modified basis with a limit of 200 entries. As the second wave of the virus descended on the UK in early fall, it became clear that holding this event, even in a modified and socially distanced fashion, was going to be a bigger challenge than expected.

The British are a determined bunch and not willing to accept defeat as a matter of course, so the organizers resolved to hold a virtual event. The entry rules were eased quite considerably from the normal rigorous vetting of your car, not to mention suspension of entry fees. Simply sign up in advance, get your official entry number and then on Sunday, the first of November, do something with your early car to commemorate the original Emancipation Run. Anything goes. You could take your car out for a spin, have a picnic or even work on your car. To get credit for the run, simply send in pictures and some detail of what you did... the ultimate virtual event.

Adria and I chose to sign up and take our 1903 Northern to this virtual event. The weather here in California is better suited to donning our finery, so we dressed up in period clothing and staged a picnic in our building. Just to show the English how good the weather can be here, as opposed to the usual cold and rain in London this time of year, we created an outdoor scene. Both of the photos were sent along to the event organizers, as requested. This last week we received an official certificate of participation and felt good that we were helping to keep the tradition alive.

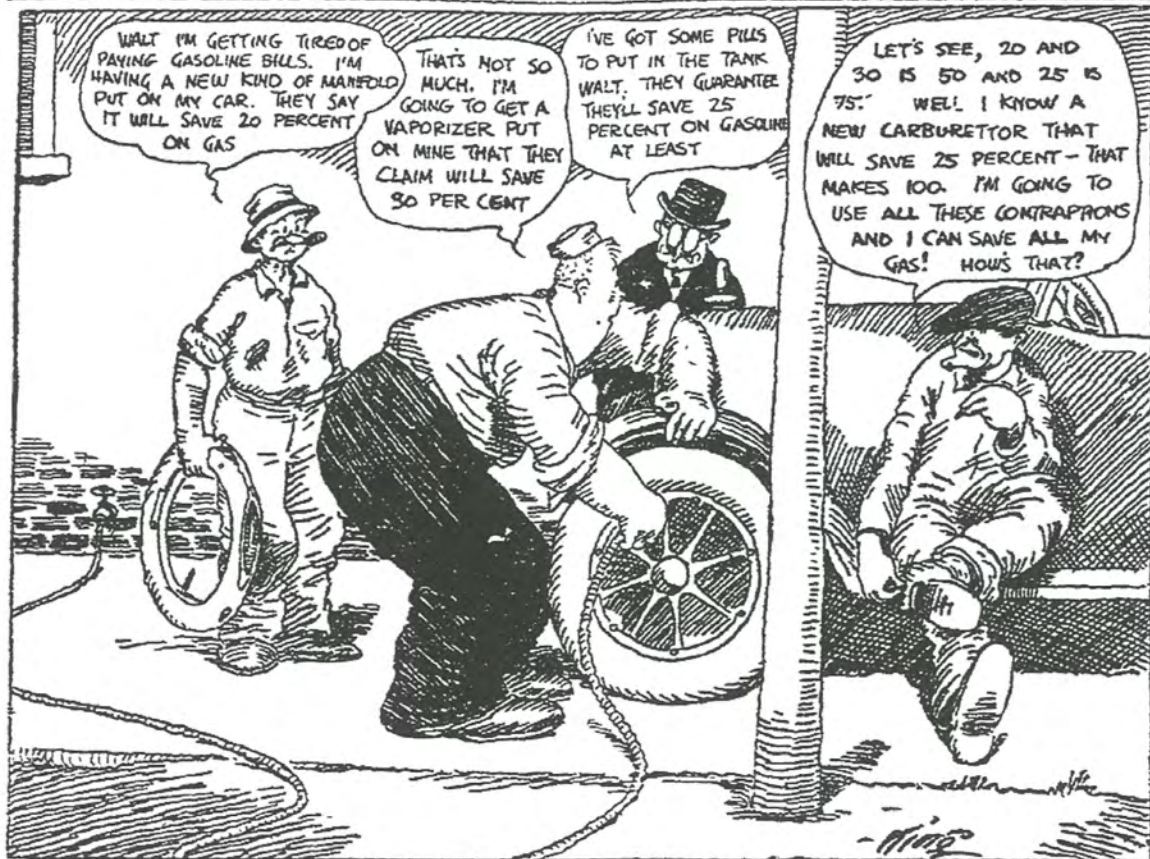

# THE AUTOMOBILE AS A MOVING PICTURE PROP

**I**N ADDITION to being a modern business necessity the automobile has become one of the most important "props" of the moving-picture industry and is used by scenario writers with great abandon to project into the hearts of millions of movie fans those much desired thrills which measure up into box-office receipts.

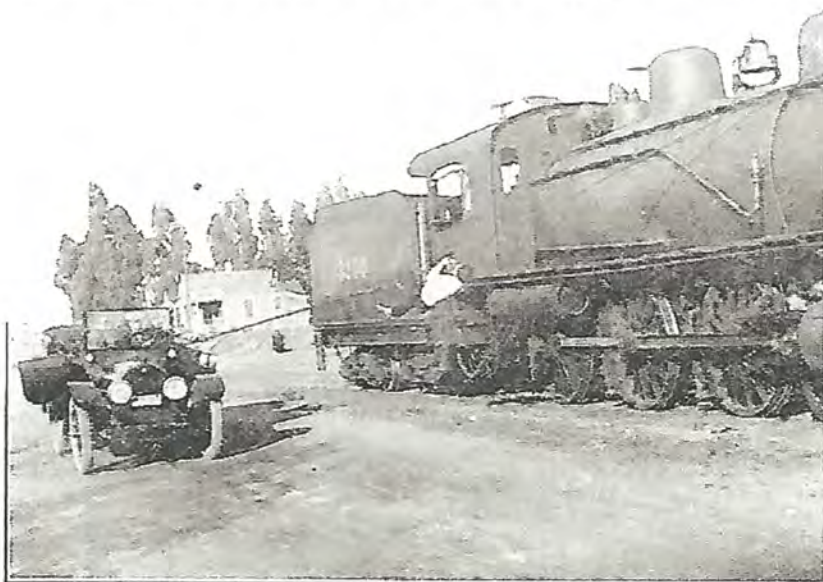
Hairbreadth escapes, where hero and heroine, eloping from irate parents, scoot across railroad tracks under the very wheels of mile-a-minute trains, are part of the automobile's duty when serving as a "prop"; while lassoing a wild locomotive and enabling the hero to swarm up into the cab and rescue a whole trainload of unsuspecting—and, it might be said, wholly fictitious—passengers from train wreck and sudden death, is merely a part of the movie automobile's day's work.

Hairbreadth escapes from a watery death supply other and popular thrills for the movie fans, and in these the automobile may always be found doing its part. Pursuing a fleeing villain at sixty miles an hour down a wharf and diving headlong from the driver's seat while the abandoned machine balances perilously over the water's depths, is but part of the movie actor's efforts to instruct and entertain his hundred-million public, his chief assistant being the auto in its role of "prop." Automobile demonstrators, whose pleasure

and duty it is to illustrate the possibilities of the modern motor, might well, in a body, spend a definite time each year in studying the automobile as the picture-makers use it, for no feat is too difficult, no undertaking too acrobatic for the moving-picture actor when his director suggests some new movie stunt that centers around the automobile.

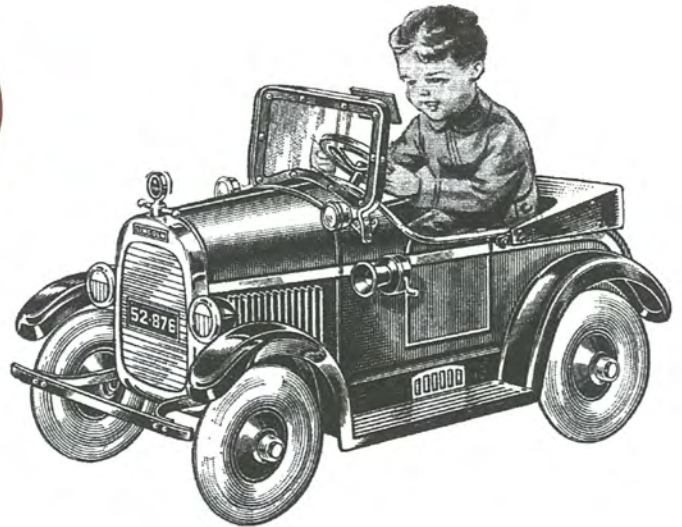

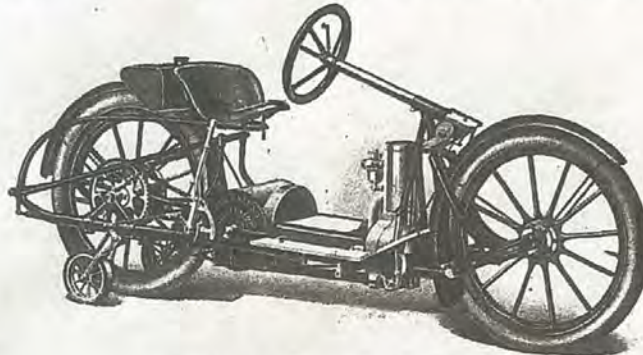
**Notes:** Some virtual visiting discussions:

- **New HCCA Website** – Russell Holden and the HCCA Website Committee have been meeting weekly since early March to go over the requirements, content, and overall improvements for our website. These efforts included the overall Project direction, web vendor meetings, a fresh website appearance, new content requirements, improved page navigation, an updated Classified Ad Section, and a new feature: The “Members Only” Section. Significant effort was put into defining the content that would be available to the public, vs that which would be a “Members Only” benefit. The committee established a photo contest to assist with building fresh content, and discussed in detail (with assistance from member John Gebhard) the development of our data base and how this will be used in our Members Only section. The Club’s roster will be available in the new section, and will include a search facility for members by name, by vehicle make and year, etc. The plan is to reduce the need for a printed roster and the increasing costs associated with that publication. Tracy Leshar is converting past Gazette issues to pdf, and the most recent 12 issues will be available for download in the “Members Only” section. The 13<sup>th</sup> (2 years old) issue will be on the public section of the site, as a teaser for potential new members. More recently the committee has been meeting with our Web vendor weekly to provide direction on logistics and layout, as well as continually building new content. The updated site is receiving its final touches, has been shown to and tested by

the HCCA Board, and will go live in early November.

# HCCA NATIONAL NEWS



**Re: Museum of the Horseless Carriage; Publication Awards; Marian Welch Awards; ....**  
**Issue: 2020-11-15 #13**

- **Museum of the Horseless Carriage** – As many of you know, there has been a desire for many years to establish a museum completely dedicated to Brass Era cars and the pioneers who made them a reality.

The willingness of the Gilmore Car Museum in Hickory Corners, Michigan to accept us as one of the partner museums on their 90-acre property is really the only practical answer.

We have begun a three-year capital campaign to raise \$3,000,000 which will be used to build the 10,000 square foot building, pay for the display materials and furnishings, as well as create a \$1,300,000 endowment to insure its long-term viability. The first step in that process is to create a display in the existing Steam Barn, which is currently underway.

One of the most exciting elements in this program is the plan to have a national signature HCCA event at the museum annually. The first event, A Celebration of Brass @ The Gilmore, is in the planning stages and more details will be coming very shortly in the HCCA Gazette and on the HCCA Website.

All of this will only happen if supported financially by the Horseless Carriage community. The deadline for our initial phase funding of \$100,000 is the end of 2020. The Qualifications are:

Demonstrated **Outstanding Service;**

**Dedication and, Consistent and Continuing Service** shown.

Since this is the highest honor that can be given to an HCCA member, nominations should include the following information: Membership length; Leadership positions held; Activities performed; Types of Service at the local and National levels; Efforts to promote Club values; and the Helping and Mentoring of others.

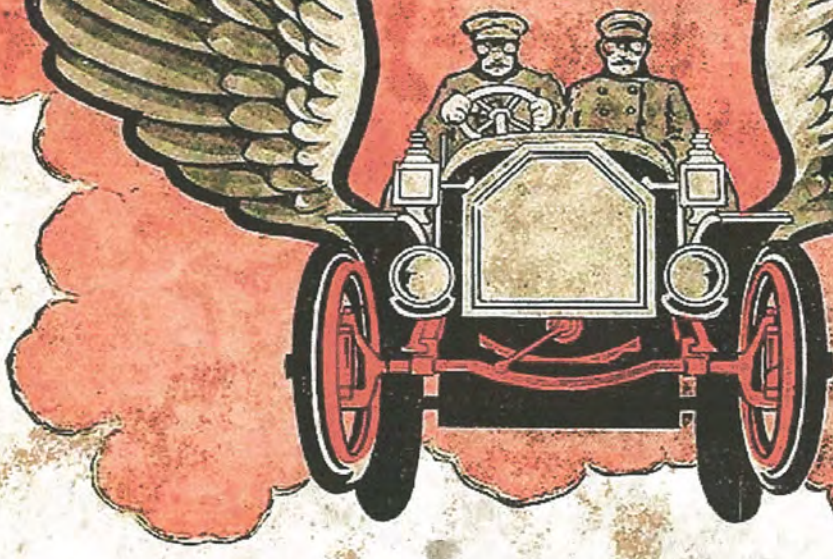
