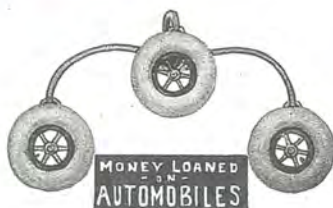

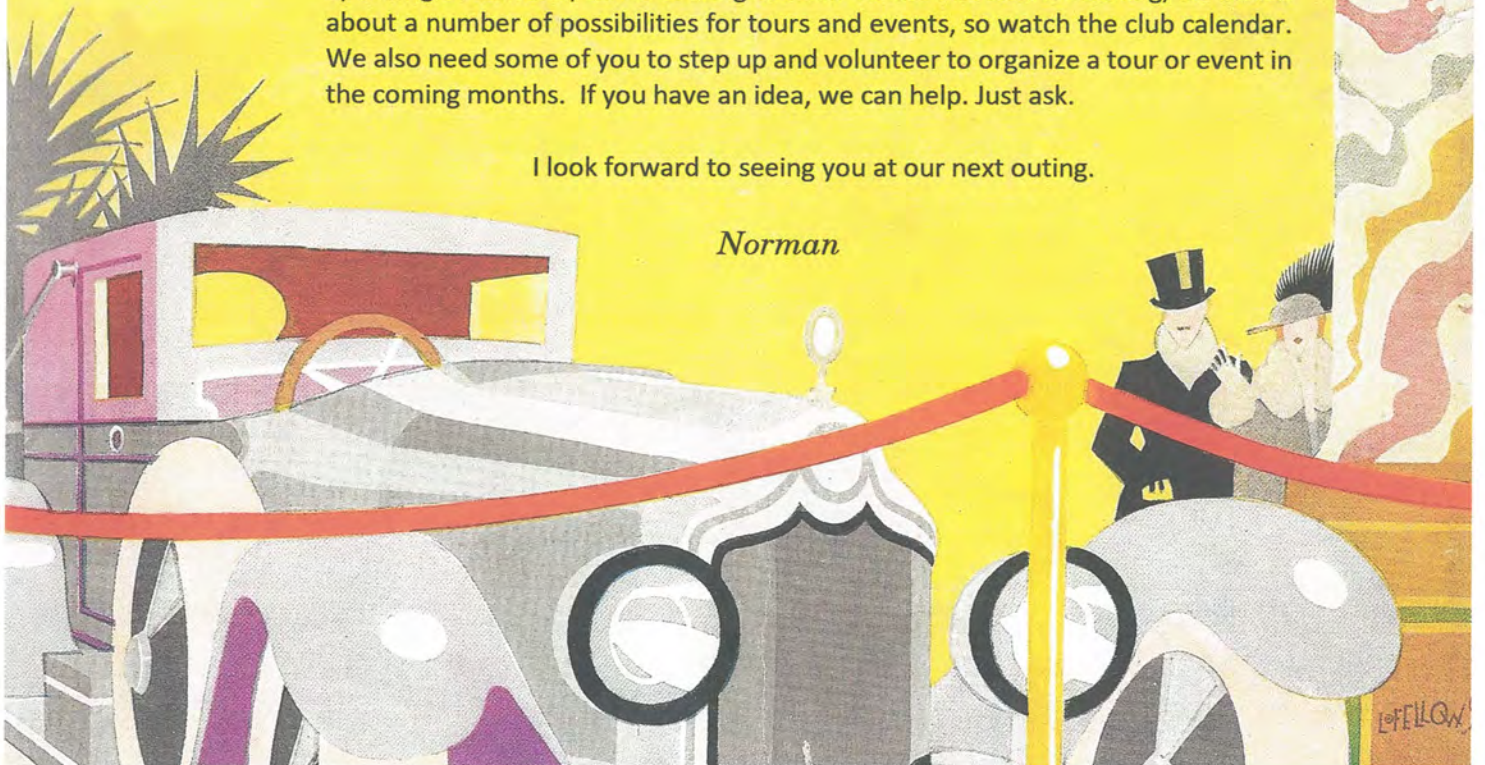

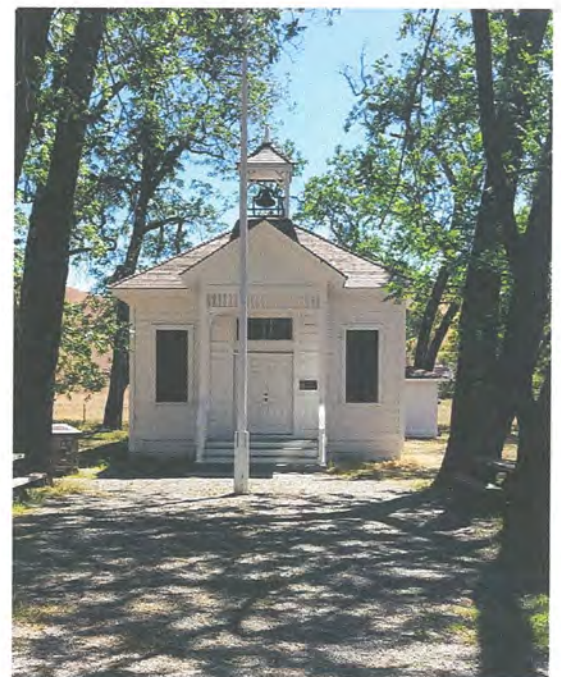

Total mileage approximately 15 miles.



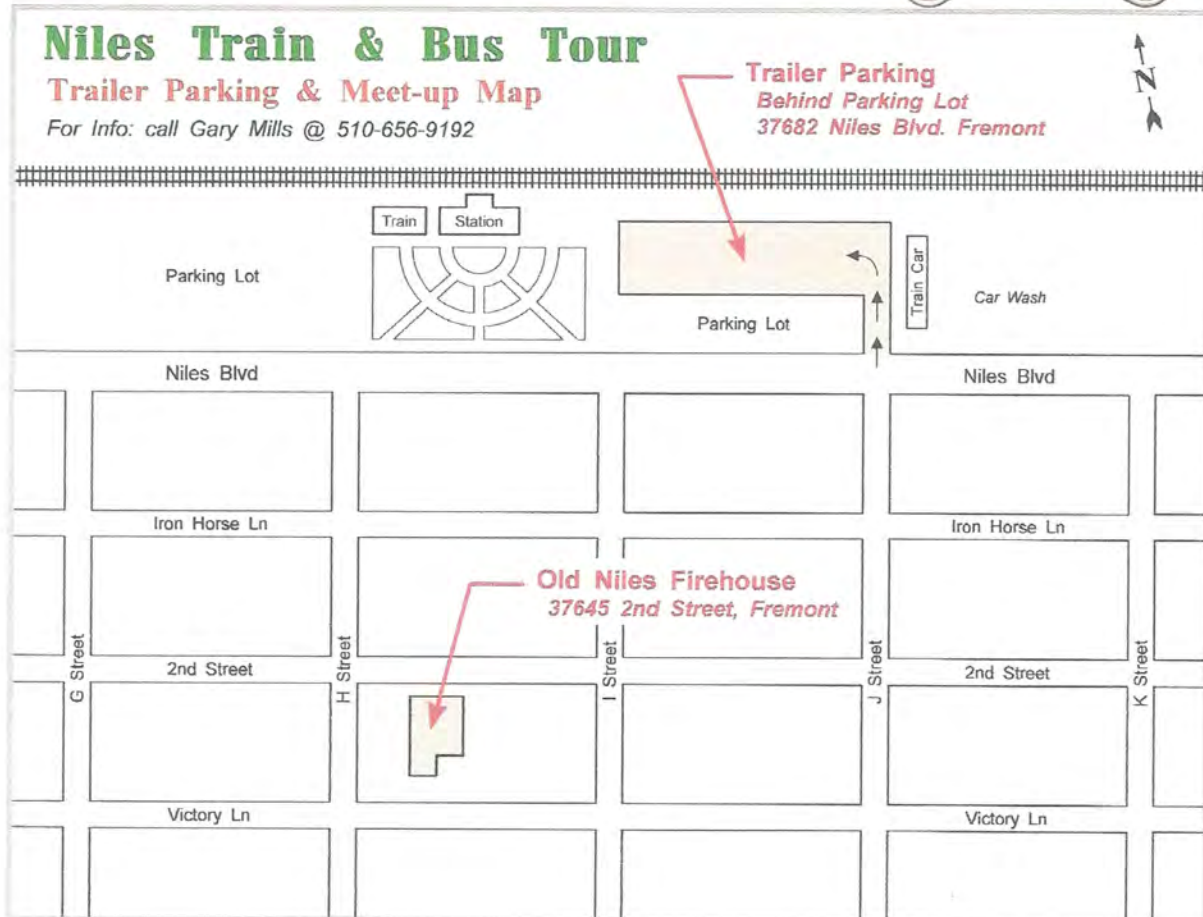
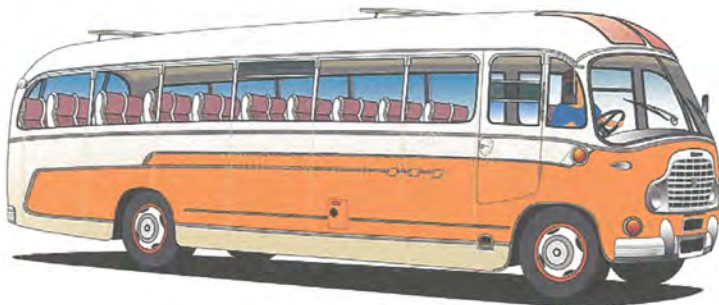

August 19th – 22nd, 2021 / California Wine Country

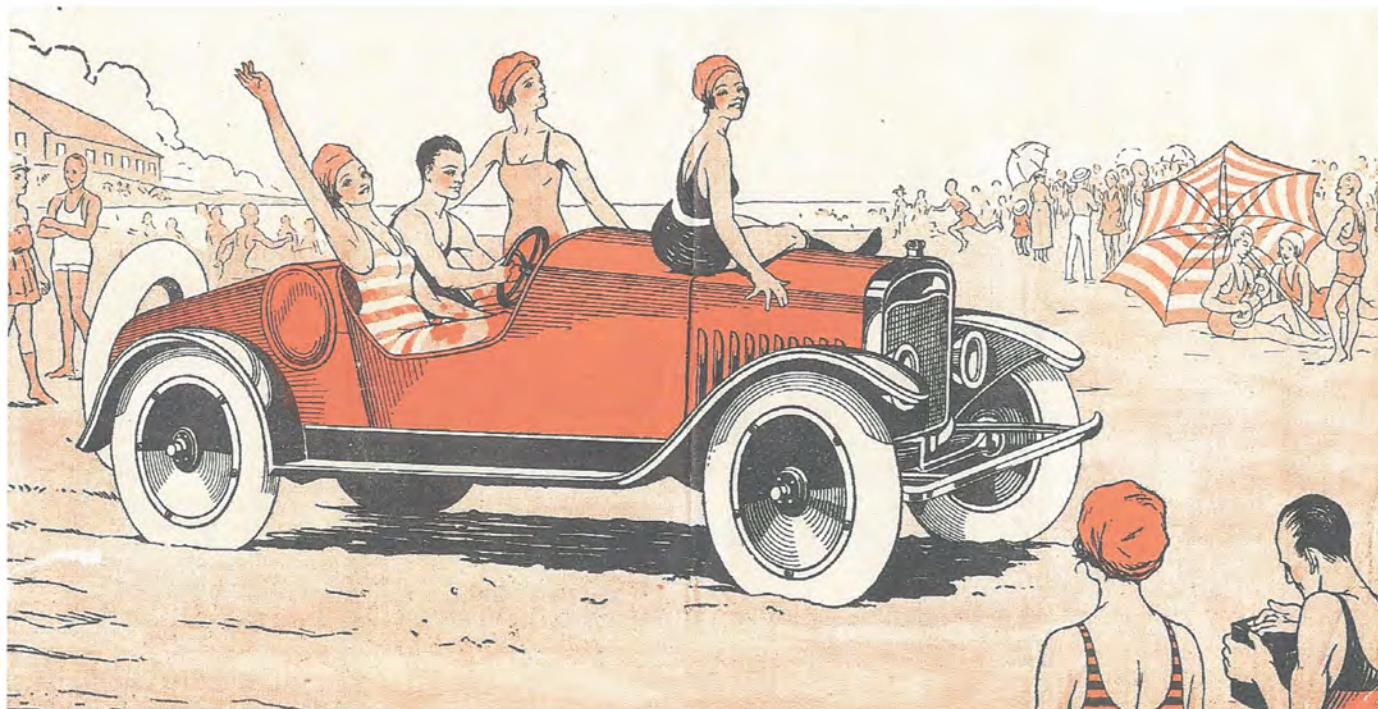

There was also interest in trying to organize something in Napa or Marin County to explore some less traveled roads.

Next, the Board discussed resumption of in person club meetings. Tony and others suggested that we might have the technical capability to conduct hybrid meetings and that it was something we should consider. In the meantime, Norman was to check with John Morrison on the reopening status of the Piedmont community center.

Hello BAHCC Members,

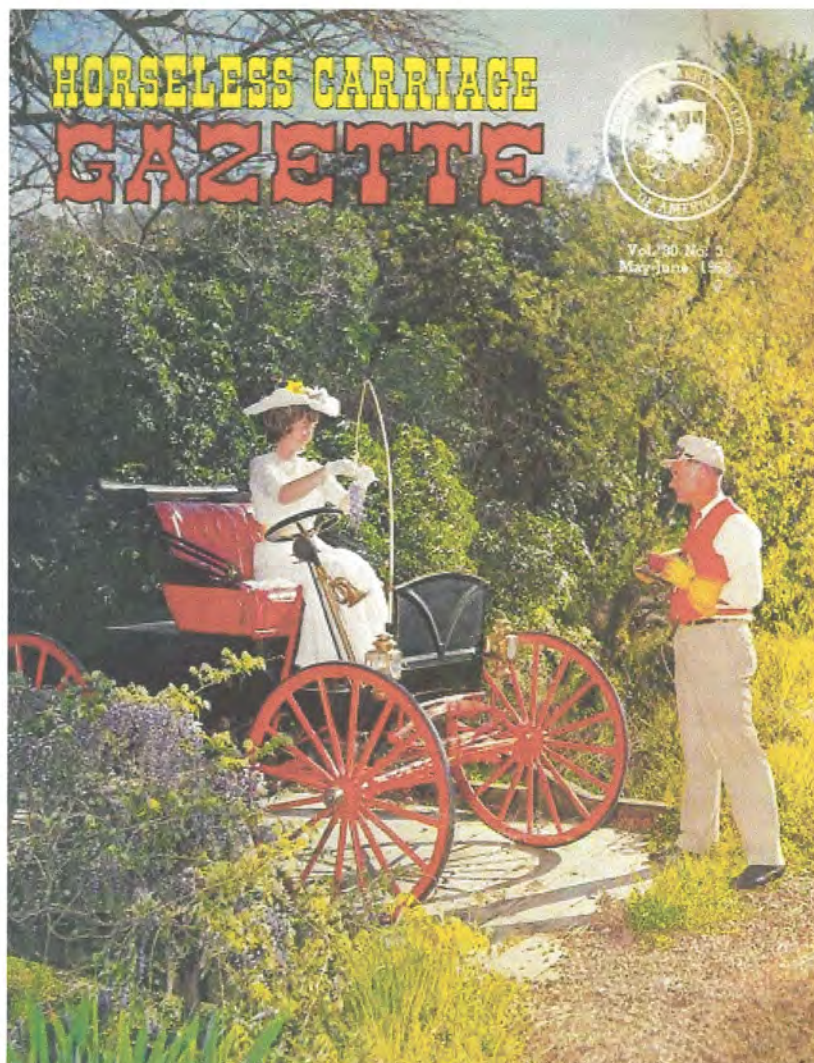
My dad and mom were BAHCC members back in the '50s and '60s and even the early '70s, until my dad passed away in 1974. In fact, he was president of the group at one time as well.

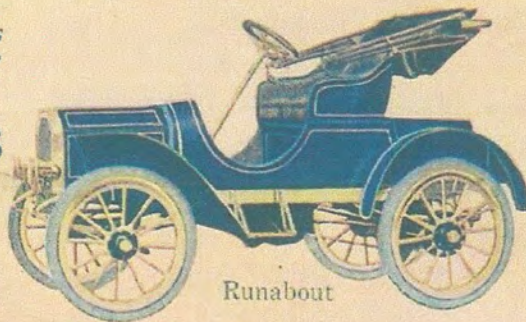
