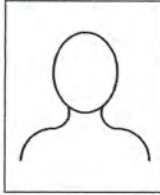

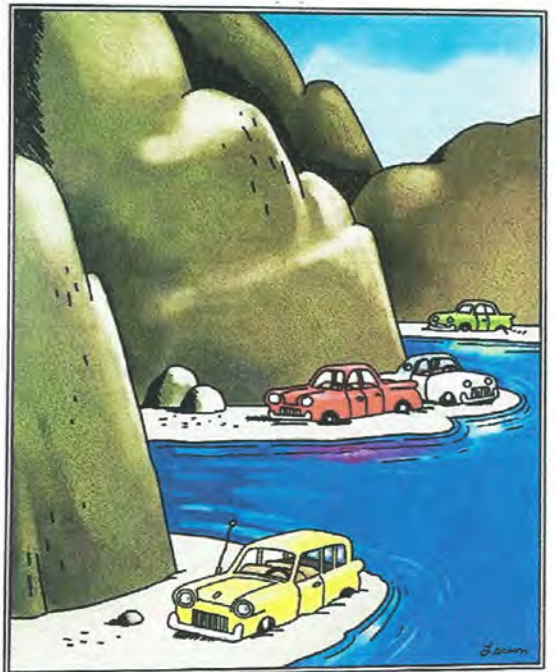

President's Message

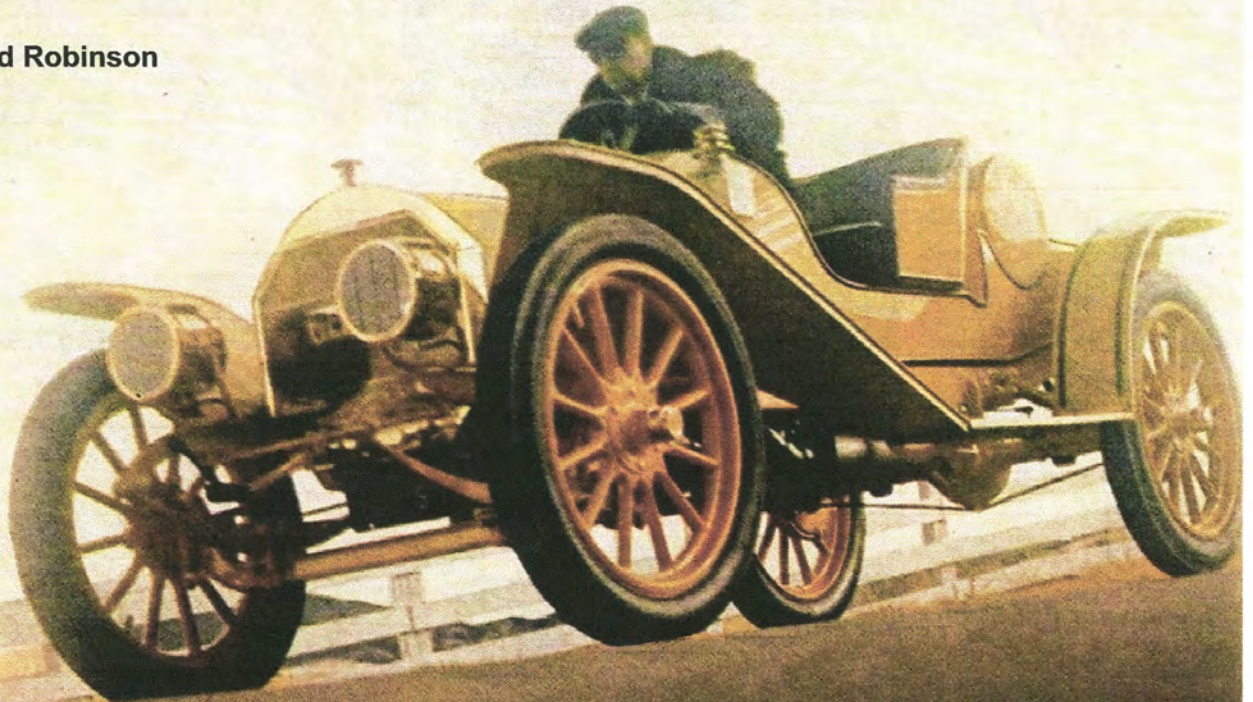
February 2022

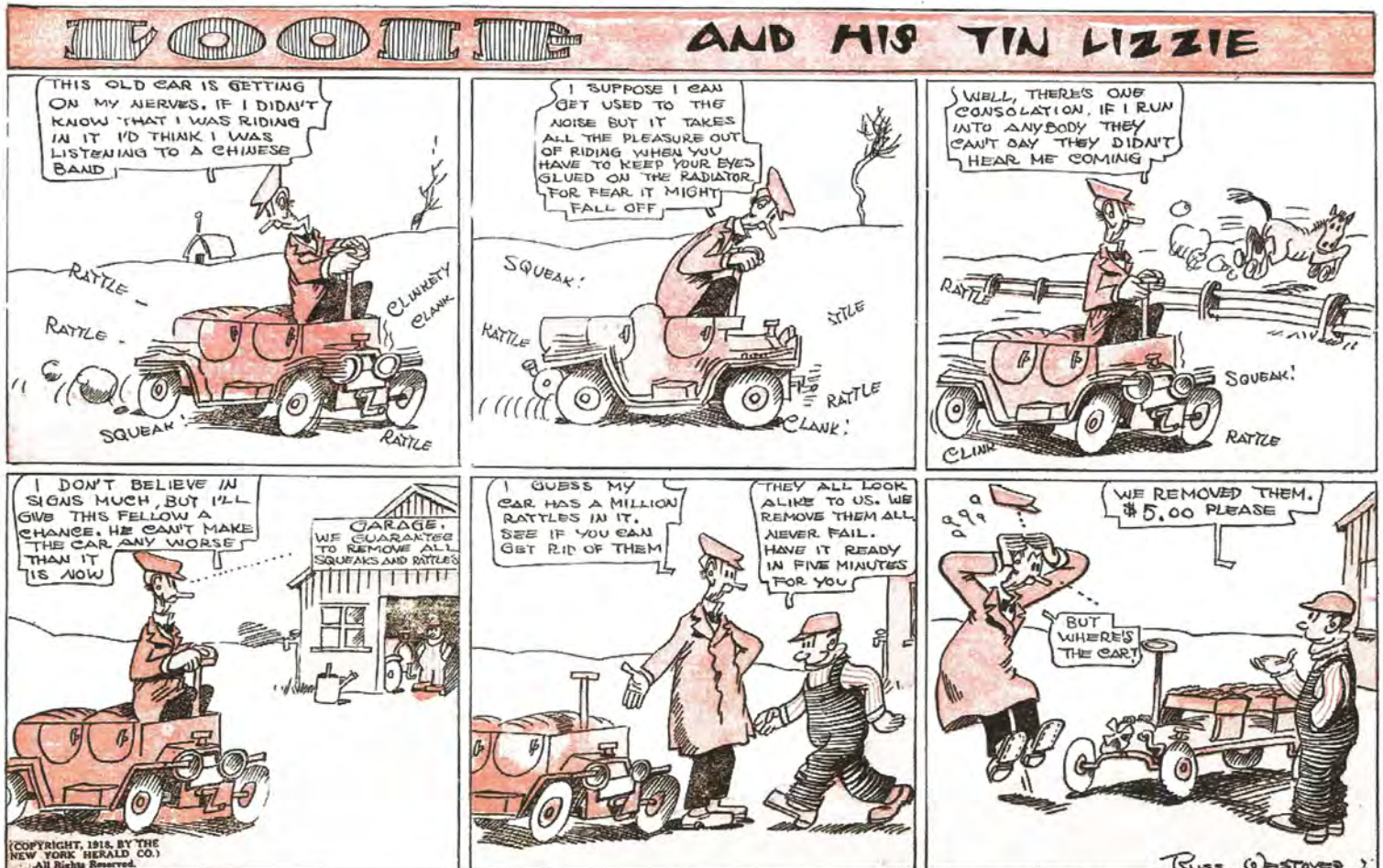

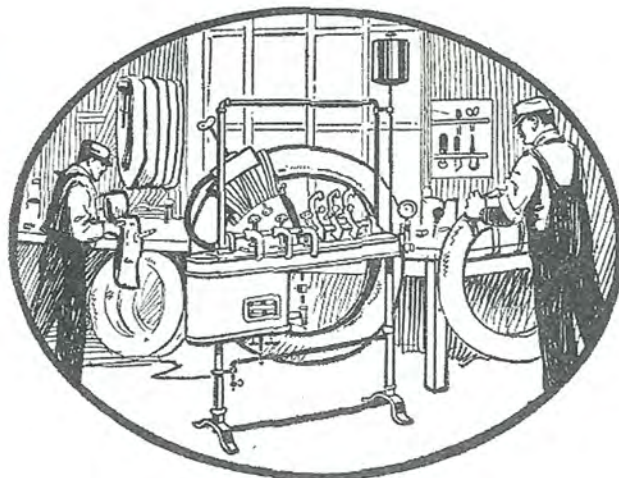

Jim Lukash has been working to coordinate moving the museum's Model T Ford to Whitney Haist's shop so we can have a Nuts and Bolts to put that Head back on the car which will involve bold extraction, valve lapping, head installation, then getting it started. Looking forward this year we will have one gathering to replace Model T Bands, and I plan to host one for either connecting rod installation on a Maxwell, or stiff steering on a Buick, more to follow.

Racers Hauled to Jacksonville Beach with MacGyvered Cadillac



It appears that R.H. Lett of Jacksonville Beach, FL, or his shop helpers were the kind of auto repair MacGyver's who were good to have around in a situation where a make-do repair or rig is needed. First, off they took an older used 1913 or '14 Cadillac touring car and turned it into a truck. Then assembled a shop-built-hand-operated towing rig with some type of a reduction gear, and a tapered boom constructed by using two salvaged auto frame members, and installed it onto the rear of the "truck."

In addition to the tow rig, a tapered towing dolly was constructed from another set of used frame rails, a narrowed axle, and a set of truck wheels with hard rubber tires. By lifting the front of the 1st racing car, putting it onto the back of the "truck" frame, and then raising the rear of it up with the tow hoist, it allowed the hitched towing dolly under it to pivot like a trailer.

The front of the second racing car was then raised and chained down to the back of the dolly. The 3rd racing car was towed by the 2nd car and apparently would all work out fine in use unless the rig had to be backed up.

The three racing cars appear to be Model "T" Ford-based, were raced on the City beach, and the 1st car seems to be equipped with an early Type "B" Roof 16-valve cylinder head.

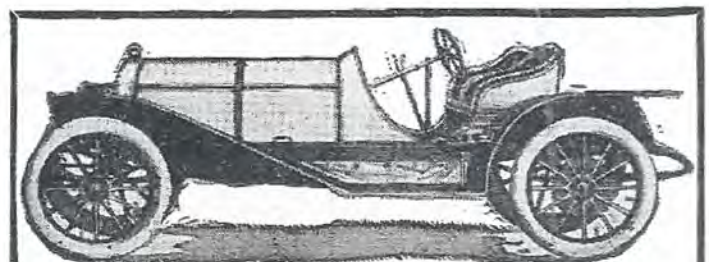

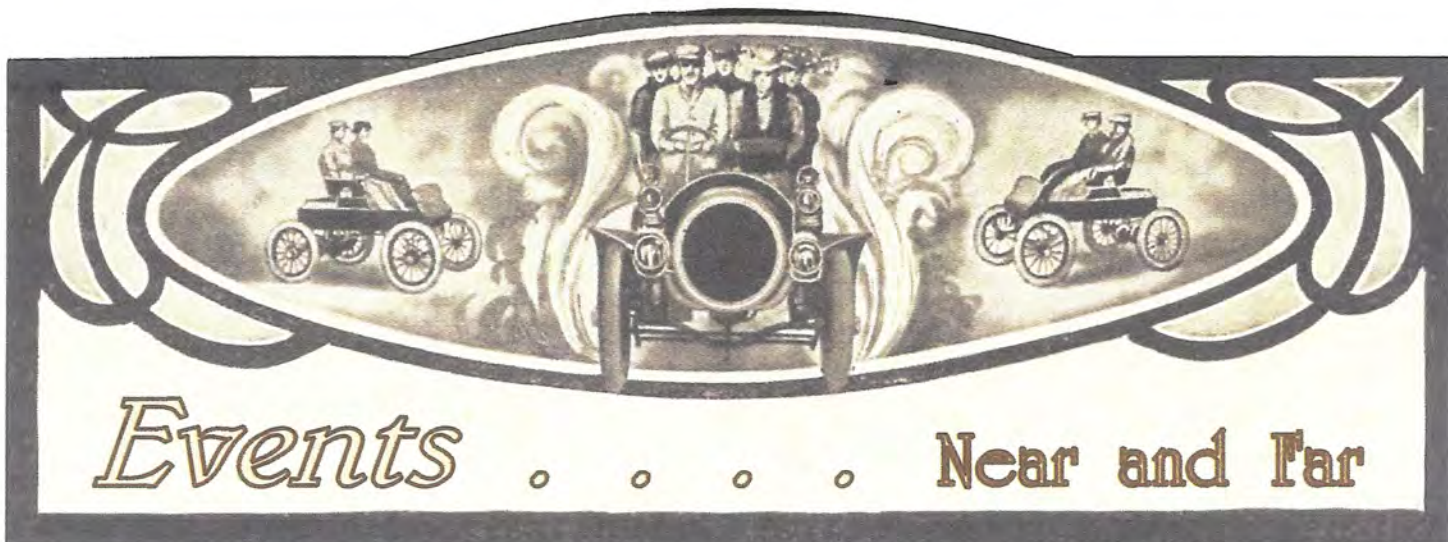

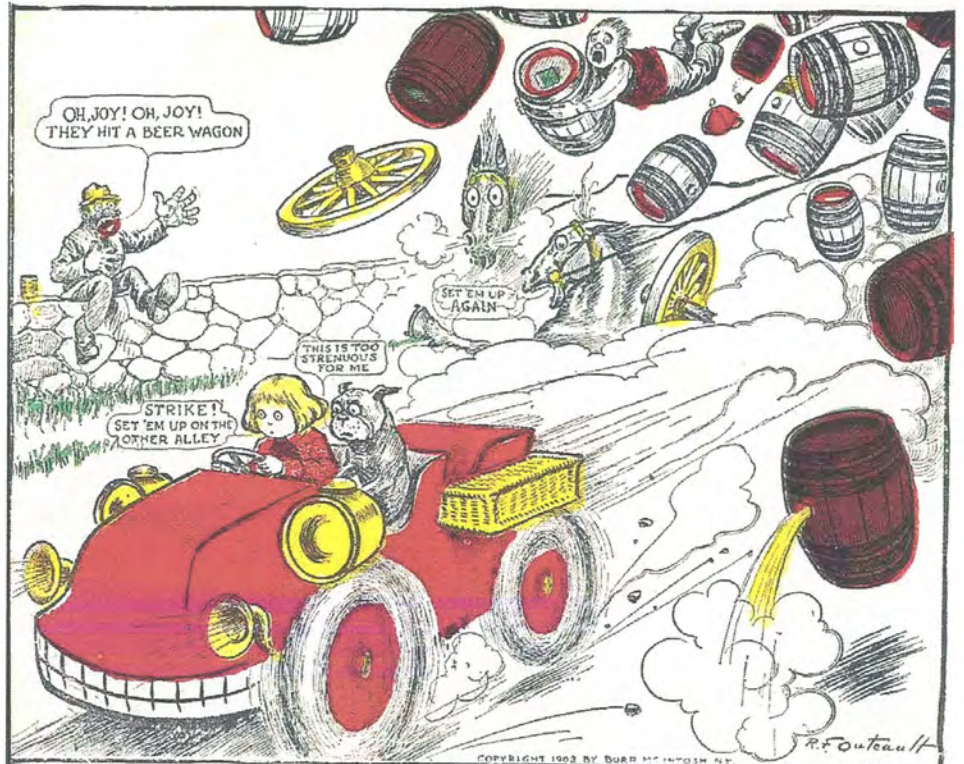
