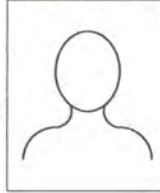

# Nuts and Bolts – May

Nuts and Bolts are still here, they keep a lot of things together. Along with the nuts and bolts are a lot of parts that make up our cars, and many other things too. We just had the Tulare Swap Meet (replacing the old Bakersfield meet), which was well attended and Gerald brought out a lot of shiny brass that someone said could be seen from outer space. Those that attended were able to sell some things and also treasures were found to take home to help put our projects back together. It's always a good meet, not only for parts, but great to see old friends and acquaintances. We catch up, swap stories, laugh, and make new memories. Next year there will be the HCCA National Convention following the swap with a tour headed up by our own Don and Joyce Azevedo, so mark your calendars.

Back at home I got my 1916 Model T Roadster back on the road after transmission band replacement and rear brake relining. It seems to be running pretty good and it's up for sale since I need room for my newest addition; 1910 Chalmers Detroit. I also am going to have a 1919 Model T touring for sale after I fix a few items. I have a 1909 Buick Model 10 that has really stiff steering, needs at least one tire tube, and a carb swap to get it back on the road. I hope to make this a future Nuts and Bolts get together.

Gerald had bought a 1915 Model T a month ago or so, that had an older restoration and has been sitting for some time. So, he dove in checking everything and found a crack in the coolant passage of the block. It is not in a critical area and after some research found that this is not uncommon for a Model T block. He proceeded to clean and repair this area with a epoxy type product and internally cleaning and sealing the coolant passage. He has learned a tremendous amount about Model T's in the past year and may become a future resource for authenticity, and repair. Speaking of resources, our new website is going to have a resource page which will be a great place to find help for our various problems we run into with our old cars. Check it out and we need input to keep it current which we hope to have online soon.

We have a Nuts and Bolts get together planned for May;

Vince O'Brien is hosting and has two interesting projects for the group; 1) Assemble a REO steering box (parts have been reproduced/repared) and 2) Adjust the friction drive on a Sears Motor Buggy. This will all be in a beautiful setting in Novato! Food will be provided too!

**Food:** Coffee, tea, sodas & water donuts and then pizza.
